Report from the Education Committee

Three panels of the Part II Assessment were held on 1 June. Out of seven candidates, four passed their oral interviews, which marked a 57% success rate. Gratitude is extended to the Assessment Panel chairpersons and members for volunteering. Congratulations go to the successful candidates!

CPD: Accelerating Housing Delivery on Underutilised Land – Three Cases Using Modular Integrated Construction and Retrofitting Existing Building Structures (Code: 2019103)

Mr Ling Kar-kan, SBS, FHKIP, RPP, MHKIUD, Director of the Jockey Club Design Institute for Social Innovation at the Hong Kong Polytechnic University, kindly presented this CPD on 11 June.

Mr Ling explained the study objectives of exploring different options and possibilities to deliver a sizeable amount of transitional social housing (TSH) within a relatively short period of time. The Design Institute for Social Innovation (DISI) is now working with cross-

sector, cross-disciplinary design teams to study how advanced technologies, such as modular integration construction (MiC) and the retrofitting of existing buildings, can be used to reimagine underutilised sites and provide TSH. The presentation highlighted the challenges for this co-design process and the initial findings of the studies showcased how different construction methods and modern technologies could be applied to utilise deserted properties such as abandoned villages, vacant school sites, and short term tenancy sites to accelerate housing provision and promote community cohesion.
