PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE 會長的話

must begin with sad news and I am sure you share my sorrow. Mr Michael Mann, our President from 1993 to 1995, passed away on 23 July in the United Kingdom. We are grateful for his contributions and support of both the Institute and profession. Sr Chau Bingche, Henry, Building Surveying Division Council member, passed away in a traffic accident this month. We ask all members to support his family.

It has been a busy month and as always I am pleased to share where my presidency has taken me. And with summer winding down, we look forward to an equally eventful autumn when key events and activities make welcome returns since the pandemic.

Government policy advice

The HKIS is backing the Government's development plan to make the San Tin Technopole into an Innovation and Technology hub for the Northern Metropolis following a public consultation. On 9 August we and other six professional institutes held a press conference and issued a joint statement to

that effect. The HKIS also presented our own paper that we hope will contribute to the zone's success, including views on competitive land premium, flexibility in planning and land deeds and the participation of private enterprises. Our view alone emphasises building a university as the area's research centre.

Public consultation on the Chief Executive's 2023 Policy Address is underway and I gave the Institute's views at Government online sessions: on 10 August, on the need to provide more public housing; and on 11 August on providing more land and housing. I suggested that the Government should take back more than 200 vacant school sites and change their land use to public or private housing. Green space might also be changed to public or private housing, where this will have no affect environmentally. A more aggressive suggestion was to change the land use on the peripheries of country parks with existing good transport links that have the potential for public or private housing.

Understanding the Mainland

On 18 August, a day trip to Guangzhou's Nansha district organised by the Hong Kong Coalition of Professional Services proved fruitful. A quicker trip on the high-speed rail allowed us to make the most of our time visiting key industrial establishments like international shippers and centres of scientific and technological innovation. We learnt more about how Nansha connects to the world by collaborating with Hong Kong.

I led a delegation to Shanghai for an exchange with local authorities and visits on 20–23 August. Details of "HKIS Shanghai Visit 2023" are in the HKIS News.

Supporting trade partners

I was honoured to be a guest speaker at one of the series of public talks marking the 50th Anniversary of Jardine House on 26 August. This Central icon was Asia's tallest building when completed in 1973. The HKIS feels a real sense of belonging having had our office there for fifteen years from 1998. I gave the surveyor's perspective on the construction of Jardine House and focused on various aspects of the project, its shorter construction time than other commercial buildings, its cost, quality, safety, and improvement works.

Construction Safety Week 2023 kicked off on 28 August, its main theme "United For A New Site Safety Chapter" with safety promotional activities lined up until 3 September, including a conference, exhibition, and site visit. Since the Construction Industry Council waived our qualified members from its Mandatory Basic Safety Training (Green Card) Course, I encourage them to support safety activities and keep safety paramount.

Addressing community concerns

The Institute has expressed grave concern over concrete chunks and rendering falling off old buildings recently. We issued a press release calling for greater care for public safety. Building maintenance is owners' responsibility and we strongly urge them to appoint qualified professionals to carry out regular inspections then act fast to eliminate identified risks.

On a similar note, the HKIS met the Consumer Council's Chief Executive, Ms Gilly Wong, and her staff on 1 August to discuss a building diagnostic and inspection service. We will formulate industry guidelines internally before re-engaging the Council.

Sowing the seeds of surveying

Congratulations to the 44 students awarded HKIS Scholarships and 17 postgraduate students given 2022 Dissertation Awards. At the presentation ceremony on 25 July, I reiterated the Institute's continuing goal to encourage younger generations to take up surveying. Moreover, CPD courses are pivotal in preparing for challenges in an ever-changing world. My sincere thanks to judges, our Board of Education, secretariat and other units that ensured a successful event.

The conference season began with the General Practice Division's Annual Conference on 19 August. Ms Bernadette Linn, JP, Secretary for the Development, spoke on the conference theme of how to attract more young people to our industry and empower them to contribute to future development. We look forward to the signature HKIS Annual Conference 2023 on 9 September.

政府政策諮詢

經過公眾諮詢後,學會支持政府將新田科技城打造 成北部都會區創科中心。8月9日,我們與其他六 個專業團體就此召開新聞發布會,並發表聯合聲明。 此外,學會亦提交諮詢文件,當中包括有競爭力的 地價、規劃和土地契約的靈活度,以及私營機構參 與等看法,希望能藉此為該區的成功發展出一分力。 我們更特別提出,當局應建設一所大學,以作為該 地區的研究中心。

行政長官 2023 年施政報告的公眾諮詢正在進行, 我代表學會透過政府網上會議積極發表意見:我於 8月10日建議當局有需要提供更多公營房屋;亦於 8月11日建議當局供應更多土地和房屋。我也提議 政府收回超過 200 個空置校舍用地,並將其土地用 途改作公營房屋或私人住宅。綠化用地亦可在不影 響環境的情況下,改作公營或私人房屋。我亦提出 一項更進取的建議 — 挑選目前具備良好交通網絡、 有潛力建設公營房屋或私人住宅的郊野公園邊陲地 帶,並改變它們的土地用途。

了解祖國

我非常榮幸於8月26日為怡和大廈50周年系列 對談活動擔任演講嘉賓。這座位於中環的標誌性建 築於 1973 年竣工,是當時亞洲最高的建築物。自 1998年起,香港測量師學會更在該廈設立辦事處達 15年之久,故對這座建築擁有莫大的歸屬感。活 動當日我以測量師的身份分享對怡和大廈建設的看 法,並集中項目的不同方面,如探討怡和大廈比其 他商業大廈使用更短的施工時間、成本、質素、安 全和改善工程。

「建造業安全週2023 | 於8月28日拉開序幕,今 年的主題為「攜手共創工地安全新篇」,並於開幕 當天至9月3日舉行一系列安全推廣活動,包括會 議、展覽、實地考察等。由於建造業議會豁免學會 合資格的會員參加強制性基本安全訓練(綠卡)課 程,我鼓勵會員支持各項安全活動,並時刻堅守安 全第一的原則。

應對社區關注的問題

Unlocking Potential of Spatial Data for Smart City Development

The HKSAR government has been advocating the smart city blueprint which encompasses smart mobility, living, environment, people, government, and economy. Among various initiatives, the first Common Spatial Data Infrastructure (CSDI) Portal, a map-based digital infrastructure as a one-stop platform to open and share certain spatial data of the government, has been in full operation since the end of 2022. Among these quality spatial data, high-quality territory-wide 3D digital maps are expected to cover the entire Hong Kong in the near future. In this issue, surveyors will elaborate on the potential of spatial data with emphasis on 3D digital maps in Hong Kong, as this is the pre-requisite dataset for the development of digital twin.

Evolution from 2D to 3D

With the availability of 2D digital maps in the late 1980s, the advanced survey and mapping technologies and high-performance computing, 3D digital maps (Figure 1) covering Kowloon East with individualised models of about 6,500 buildings and about 420 infrastructures including flyovers, footbridges and subways were released last year. The rest will be launched in four phases so that the entire Hong Kong is expected to be covered soon. 3D digital maps, developed by the Lands Department, demonstrates that map production in Hong Kong has gone beyond 2D digital maps to reach new heights.

There are technical challenges in Hong Kong regarding 3D digital maps. The high density of highrise buildings in the urban areas means unmanned aerial vehicle (UAV) may not be able to take photos in certain areas. Mobile mapping system, which involves collection of geo-spatial data from mobile vehicles, might not work in narrow alleys. The alternative would involve surveyors carrying survey equipment such as portable mobile mapping system walking and capturing images. Updating 3D digital maps could also be time-consuming, and yet necessary.

Sr Prof Winnie Shiu, HKIS Past President, said, "Building Information Modelling (BIM) provides project-specific information about design, materials, and project information etc. Once an as-built simplified project 3D model in BIM is integrated into the surrounding 3D digital maps in Geographic Information System (GIS), which is at the top of the

hierarchy and which covers the real, world-wide environment, there will be a full picture of 3D digital maps."

"Full-fledged 3D digital maps are 'full-fledged' because they will be territory-wide and they have the 'what-you-see-is-what-you-get' capability to show even facades of buildings. They are 'digital twins' of the environment we see physically. Adding 3D pedestrian network to the 3D digital map would provide door-to-door routing, which is more advanced than common online maps that only show routings but not how pedestrians go across footbridges and enter building entrances. Full-fledged 3D digital maps and 3D pedestrian network (Figure 2) can show how one should enter buildings, as if one is onsite."

Sr Paul Tsui, Chairman of HKIS Land Surveying Division, stated, "3D digital maps boast the advantages of having enhanced details and higher resolutions territory-wide. These 3D photorealistic maps can clearly show building facades. It is useful in urban planning and environmental assessment applications."

The two seasoned surveyors explained that 3D digital maps are composed of building models, infrastructure models and terrain models, so as to provide city information environment, network information environment, and landscape information environment.

The government has identified certain buildings in Hong Kong as pilots for indoor maps, which can be incorporated into the building models. If combined with Internet of Things (IoT), users can learn about what happens at the locations through real-time information such as those related to central air-conditioning and smart toilets. Infrastructure models encompass roads, bridges, and potentially more minute details such as direction of roads. Terrain models show profiles, slopes, trees etc.

Contributing to smart city

Surveyors have important roles to play in smart city development. Land Surveyors collect geo-spatial information via field work, maintain data, ensure positional accuracy, analyse and share them via GIS platform. Building Surveyors use the information

for maintenance. Quantity Surveyors use BIM to take quantity of materials and costings, as well as integrate BIM and GIS to evaluate progress. General Practice Surveyors use Geographic Assisted Mass Appraisal (GAMA) for valuation. Property and Facility Management Surveyors use As-Built BIM upon site handover for facility management. Planning and Development Surveyors on the other hand, integrates preliminary 3D design model in the GIS environment during the feasibility study and technical assessment stage.

3D digital maps and other relevant spatial data can be used as tools to solve housing and land issues. "The Urban Renewal Authority for instance, has set up the Urban Renewal Information System (URIS) to improve the organisation's capability to process and analyse planning information and spatial data," Sr Prof Shiu remarked.

Sr Tsui remarked, "3D digital maps on GIS, together with relevant modelling software, can also be used to optimise the coverage of digital terrestrial TV broadcasting in a given area. As for the public, 3D digital maps enable them to visualise future development such as the Northern Metropolis during planning stage, help road users find less congested routes and assist shoppers to navigate in shopping malls."

Both surveyors hope there would be more companies developing applications using the open geospatial data to benefit the public for developing Hong Kong into a smart city. For instance, retailers can access demographic data to determine where they should open new branches. Developers of mobile games may develop location-based applications. There are also applications that help people visiting cemeteries to locate tombs of ancestors.

Although at present there are over 600 types of datasets in the CSDI portal, Sr Prof Shiu added that with the availability of spatial data, she would encourage the industries to make use of the available spatial datasets, apply geospatial artificial intelligence (GeoAI) and connect them with Artificial Intelligence of Things (AIoT) sensors to collect real-time spatial data information. With these, they may develop various types of smart applications for supporting the Hong Kong Smart City Blueprint initiatives.

A proof-of-concept application that is worth mentioning is the prediction of Mosquito Risk Index (MRI)(https://geoaimq.ln.edu.hk/en/) to predict and tackle mosquito-borne disease. Developed by Lingnan University in collaboration with their industry partner and supported by the Innovation and Technology Fund, the application puts together a wide range of technologies. It adopts environmental variables such as building, road, greenery and water densities to illustrate the local environment, and the meteorological variables such as air temperature, relative humidity, and rainfall referenced from Hong Kong Observatory. It applies GIS and AI technologies to compile and analyse all the collected data from the intelligent mosquito killer lamps and weather stations, along with the environmental data, meteorological data and Gravitrap Index to examine the relationship between the dependent and the predicting factors and to develop MRI. The ultimate goal is to create a real-time web application and dashboard that can interactively display a map-based MRI for Hong Kong and help the general public identify mosquito hotspots as well as be alert to the spread of mosquitoborne diseases.

The example above has fully demonstrated the Smart Living goal, as it provides near-real-time support for dengue fever risk prediction. It meets the aim of Smart Environment as it utilises solar-powered IoT sensors conducive to green and energy-reducing cities. It is in line with the Smart People objective, as it establishes a complete intelligent anti-mosquito and early warning system which facilitates users of mosquitokilling lamps (such as properties, schools, hospitals, etc) and public groups concerned about the risk of dengue fever. It fulfils the Smart Government vision, as the near-real-time MRI will facilitate the government to provide more immediate and wider coverage of dengue fever risk warnings and make decisions supported by real-time data support. Sr Prof Shiu therefore recommended the government to provide more venues for installing the intelligent mosquito killer lamps and the weather stations (see Fig 1) in this study so as to generate a territory-wide MRI index for the benefit of all.

With the availability of 3D indoor maps of some buildings in Hong Kong, Sr Prof Shiu also encouraged the industries to develop smart applications for supporting the elderlies for health and safety reasons so that appropriate measures can be taken in advance to avoid fatal situations. For example, AloT real-time sensors such as breath and sleep monitoring devices, fall detection sensors and antiwandering devices could be applied.

Incentivising private sector to share data

Yet another issue is to encourage the private sector to share information so as to increase efficiency and fully utilise the platform already built. "Whereas the government is sharing their geo-spatial information data on CSDI, it would be beneficial to all if the private sector is willing to share their open data. The government may consider exploring incentives, such as providing support to them to convert their existing data, proposing to those who share data not to share future proposals on the grounds of competition, and hoping that they may be willing to share existing data," Sr Prof Shiu continued.

Both surveyors believe spatial data should not lead to privacy concerns, as the Personal Data (Privacy) Ordinance ensures that no personal data will be made known. "Just like the cases in other commonly used online maps, licence plates and people's faces are masked on maps. Real-time information about pedestrian flow is highly-aggregated such that there is no information about individuals' locations." Sr Tsui remarked.

The way forward

Spatial data in CSDI have five characteristics: they have data specifications, metadata, location information; they are in open and machine-readable format; and they are available in Application Programming Interface (API). Anyone can download and utilise them to develop their own applications. The advantage of using the API is that once the application programmer copies the link into one's application, there will be automatic updates in one's application whenever there are data updates in the CSDI Portal.

Sr Prof Shiu believes that the launch of CSDI portal in 2022 has positive effects on Hong Kong's ranking in the Smart City Index that has risen to number nine in 2023, as released by the International Society for Urban Informatics. She looks forward to the continued effort by the government to align all the framework spatial data theme with the international geospatial standards set by United Nations Committee of Experts on Global Geospatial Information Management (UN-GGIM). "In Deging, China, the United Nations Global Geospatial Knowledge and Innovation Centre adopts the international geospatial standards set up by UN-GGIM. Hong Kong should integrate with the data hub in the mainland especially the Greater Bay area by using the same standards for enabling cross boundary data sharing." She continued saying that there is a need for 3D spatial data to cover the underground structures together with 3D cadastre, both above and below ground, to create a complete digital twin for Hong Kong.

Sr Tsui also thinks that Hong Kong is doing reasonably well when compared with international standards, owing to the fact that Hong Kong is relatively small and there is greater need for 3D digital maps in the city full of high-rises. He is positive towards CSDI which is offering free download of maps that used to cost millions. Reception from professionals and the public is yet to be evaluated.

開拓空間數據潛能促進智慧城市發展

香港特區政府致力推廣智慧城市藍圖,包括智慧出行、生活、環境、市民、政府、經濟等各範疇。在眾多的措施中,首個空間數據共享平台(CSDI),即以地圖為本的數碼基建、用以開放和分享政府空間數據的一站式平台,已於2022年底全面投入服務。在眾多空間數據當中,涵蓋全港各地的高質三維數碼地圖即將陸續面世。今期,兩位測量師將闡釋空間數據的潛力,並重點探討本港的三維數碼地圖,即發展「數碼孿生」的先決條件之一。

從二維到三維的演變

隨著 80 年代後期二維數碼地圖推出,測量、繪製地圖技術、電腦高效能運算處理日益精進,三維數碼地圖(圖一)亦於去年推出,涵蓋東九龍約6500 座建築物及約420 座包括行車行人天橋和隧道等基礎設施的單體化模型。其他三維數碼地圖將分四個階段陸續推出,預計不久將可以覆蓋全港各地區。由地政總署開發的三維數碼地圖面世,標誌着香港的地圖製作已超越二維數碼地圖,再創新高。

在香港,製作三維數碼地圖存在不少技術困難。 高樓大廈林立,代表無人機或不能在某些地區拍攝。移動測繪系統需要透過移動中的車輛收集地 理空間數據,然而在狹窄小巷中則不太可行。替 代方案是依賴人力,攜帶便攜式移動測繪系統, 一邊步行一邊擷取影像。雖然更新三維數碼地圖 很費時,但絕對有必要。 香港測量師學會前會長蕭慧儀教授測量師表示:「建築信息模擬(BIM)為個別項目提供有關設計、物料、以及項目的資訊。當建築信息模擬的竣工模式簡化版三維項目數據被整合在地理信息系統(GIS)中,而後者囊括周邊三維數碼地圖、位於系統最頂層、涵蓋真實的全球環境,那麼涵蓋全貌的三維數碼地圖將會成形。」

「全面的三維數碼地圖之所以全面,皆因它們涵蓋全港各區,並有『見圖如見物』的功能,即使建築物的外牆也一目了然。三維地圖就如我們在現實環境下所看到的一樣,可謂與實景雙生的『數

碼孿生』。在三維數碼地圖中加入三維行人道路 網 (圖二),為使用者提供點到點路徑,遠比一 般的網上地圖優勝。一般網上地圖只有路徑實景, 不能顯示行人該如何橫過天橋、進入大廈等;全 面的三維數碼地圖和三維行人道路網,則可以展 示如何走進建築物的畫面,如同置身現場。」

香港測量師學會十地測量組主席徐開源測量師指 出:「三維數碼地圖能以更清晰細節和更高解像 度顯示全城的狀況。這些像真的三維地圖能清楚 顯示建築物的外牆,對於城市規劃和環境評估應 用很有幫助。|

兩位資深測量師解釋,三維數碼地圖包含建築物 模型、基礎建設模型和地形模型,以顯示城市資 訊環境、網絡資訊環境和景觀資訊環境。

政府物色了本港一些大廈作為建立室內地圖的試 點,室內地圖可融合在建築物模型內。若配合物 聯網 (IoT) 一起使用,瀏覽人士可以透過實時資訊 加深了解該些地方,譬如有關中央空調、智慧廁 所等數據。基礎建設模型包括道路和橋樑,未來 可能加設道路方向等更精細的資料。地形模型展 示地貌輪廓、斜坡、樹木等等。

為智慧城市作貢獻

測量師在智慧城市的發展上擔任著重要的角色。 土地測量師透過實地考察收集地理空間資訊,並 維護數據及確保地理位置準確,以及通過地理信 息系統分析與發佈數據。建築測量師使用資訊作 維修保養。工料測量師利用建築信息模擬計算物 料的數量與成本,以及整合建築信息模擬與地理 信息系統,以評估進度。產業測量師利用地理輔 助估價。在項目交收予物管時,物業設施管理測 量師會使用竣工模式的建築信息模擬。規劃及發 展測量師則在可行性研究和技術評估階段,將基 礎三維設計模型融入地理信息系統中。

三維數碼地圖及其他相關的空間數據也可以用作 紓緩房屋和土地問題的工具。蕭慧儀教授測量師 指:「市區重建局開發市區更新資訊系統,以提升 對規劃資料和地理空間數據的處理和分析能力。|

徐開源測量師補充:「地理信息系統的三維數碼 地圖配合相關模型程式,可以將一個地區內的數 碼無線電視廣播覆蓋範圍優化。對公眾而言,三 維數碼地圖則可幫助公眾想像北部都會區等發展 項目未來的發展,讓道路使用者找出暢通的行車 路徑,為購物者在商場內導航等等。|

兩位測量師均希望,更多企業可利用已開放的地 理空間數據發展相關應用程式,從而便利市民, 以及促使香港成為更優秀的智慧城市。比如説, 零售商可透過分析人口分佈數據,決定應在哪裡 開設新分店。遊戲開發商可以發展移動定位的遊 戲程式。另外,有大型墳場設有應用程式,幫助 掃墓人士尋找先人墓穴的位置。

現時空間數據平台大概有逾600類型的空間數據 集,蕭慧儀教授測量師鼓勵業界多使用開放的空 間數據,應用地理空間人工智能系統(GeoAI), 連接至人工智能物聯網 (AloT) 感應器以採集更多 實時空間數據資訊。他們可以進而開發各種智能 應用程式,支持香港智慧城市藍圖的項目。

當中值得一提的例子,是預測及撲滅蚊媒疾病的 蚊患風險指數 (MRI) (https://geoaimg.ln.edu.hk/ tc/)。該應用程式由香港嶺南大學和業界夥伴合作 研發,獲創新及科技基金資助,運用多種尖端科 技。系統收集建築物、道路、植物、水密度等環 境變量,從香港天文台收集氣溫、相對濕度、降 雨量等氣象變量信息。它運用地理信息系統和人 工智能技術以匯聚和分析所有來自智能滅蚊燈和

氣象站的數據,以及環境數據、氣象數據和誘蚊器指數,發掘相關因素和預測因素之間的關係,以製定蚊患風險指數。最終目標為建立實時網絡應用程式與儀表板,互動顯示以地圖為本的本港蚊患風險指數,讓市民知悉蚊患黑點,提防蚊媒傳播的疾病。

隨著三維室內地圖覆蓋香港部分建築物,蕭慧儀 教授測量師鼓勵業界開發更多智能應用程式,讓 長者可以認知有關健康與安全隱患,提前部署應 對方案以避免致命事故發生。這些可供使用的人 工智能物聯網實時感應器包括呼吸與睡眠監測 儀、防跌裝置、防遊走警報器等。

吸引私營機構分享數據

另一個問題,就是如何吸引私營機構分享資訊,以提高效率和更充分利用已建立的平台。蕭慧儀教授測量師續指:「儘管政府已在空間數據共享平台上分享地理空間數據,如私營機構願意開放共用數據則會更有利社會。政府可考慮提供更多誘因,例如支援他們轉換現存的數據,以不利商業競爭為由提議他們不需公開未來計劃的內容,並期望他們願意分享現有項目數據。」

兩位測量師均認為三維數碼地圖並不會引起私隱問題,因為《個人資料(私隱)條例》已保障所有個人資料均不會被公開。徐開源測量師指稱:「如同其他常用的網上地圖一樣, 車牌和人臉在地圖上會被遮蔽。有關行人的實時人流資訊都是集體合計的,因此不會有任何個人位置的資料。」

展望未來

空間數據共享平台的空間數據有五個特色:擁有數據規範、包含元數據、提供地理位置資訊、採用開放機讀格式、並透過應用程式界面提供。任何人都可下載和使用數據,以開發應用程式。平台設有應用程式界面的優點是,當程式編寫員複製連結至其應用程式後,每當空間數據平台的數據有任何改變,程式編寫員的應用程式亦會即時自動更新。

徐開源測量師亦認為按照國際標準,香港在智慧城市方面取得令人滿意的發展,相信與本港面積較小、高樓大廈林立,三維數碼地圖需求龐大等因素有關。他對空間數據共享平台的發展感到樂觀,昔日耗資數百萬元才可獲得的地圖,如今可於平台免費下載。至於專業人士和公眾對平台的反應,仍有待評估。

天上北斗赋能工程建设

随著我国北斗卫星导航系统(以下简称"北斗")的发展与应用技术的成熟,利用北斗在工程项目建设、房屋建筑监测等领域得到了很好的应用,为施工插上智慧的翅膀。

近日,为攻克地下工程装备精密定位与导航难题,中铁十二局七公司北斗融合多源传感高精度定位技术创新中心,将北斗的基准向地下空间延续,利用北斗、视觉、无线电多种定位手段,深入开展"北斗融合多源传感虚拟卫星定位系统"研发,让北斗"由天入地",助力地下工程建设精密测量和装备定位导航。

据中铁十二局七公司总工程师陈志介绍,"以往隧道工程测量只能利用北斗信号在洞口测定基准点,然后通过人工操作测量仪器将基准逐步向洞内传递,无法像地面一样利用北斗信号进行快速动态测量;利用该技术可将洞口获取的北斗基准向洞内实时传递,并,使每秒5至10次的频率进行测量对象的扫描和计算,使隧道内也能像洞外一样进行快速动态测量"。在地下工程施工中,应用该定位系统,保证测量精度的同时进一步提升了效率。

融合北斗的盾构视觉相机

目前,该技术已成功应用于湖南省长沙市地铁6号线韶光站至龙华站区间隧道以及四川省向家坝灌区北总干渠下穿岷江隧洞的盾构机定位与导航,成功解决了传统测量作业依赖人工、盾构姿态无法实时监控、狭窄空间通视条件差的难题。

"长沙地铁 6号线应用时相当于该技术的 1.0 版,在向家坝水利项目应用时进行了进一步优化,升级到了 2.0 版。"陈志表示,今年将在前期研发的基础上,对该技术持续迭代升级,进一步扩充应用场景。

位于江苏省连云港市的田湾核电站7号机组穹顶球带成功吊装,标志著该机组进入安装阶段,该机组的施工过程应用了北斗,让工地作业更加智慧。

进入施工现场的作业人员,其佩戴的安全帽、驾驶的

车辆,都安装了支持北斗的终端,借助 5G 网络、北斗等技术,相关管理人员能够及时精准了解现场施工人员和车辆的位置、详细身份、历史轨迹等信息。

在湖南省长沙市岳麓山实验室集聚区农科院片区项目,一辆白色智能无人车正在工地穿梭。 "这辆无人车搭载了北斗系统,主要用于配送施工所需的零星建筑材料,最大可装载300公斤物料。" 据项目技术负责人介绍,通过使用北斗加持的无人车配送,能大幅提高配送效率,节省人力成本,是项目近零能耗建筑方案的重要内容。

此外,在施工监管、房屋监测、塔吊运行等方面也都能看到北斗的影子。广东湛江环城高速公路南三岛大桥日前实现全线贯通,在桥梁架设阶段,北斗发挥了重要作用。

据介绍,桥梁施工架设阶段,项目引入基于北斗的架桥机安全监测系统,对桥梁架设的人员、车辆、设备等进行高精度的实时监测,通过"现场+线上"双重安全监管,实现了全线桥梁架设"零事故"的安全目标,通过标准化、机械化、智能化生产线的应用,进一步提升了施工效率与质量。

在诸多工程领域中,旋挖钻施工工程是一项复杂且技术要求高的工作。为了提高施工效率和质量,北京一家致力于北斗智慧工程应用的企业推出了一款基于北斗定位的数字化施工系统。在旋挖钻施工中,该系统通过实时监控和数字化管理,能够及时发现施工中的问题并采取措施,确保钻孔的位置、深度、角度等符合设计要求。

该系统通过精准的北斗定位技术,实现了对旋挖钻施工的全过程监控。通过实时采集数据,系统能准确反映工程进度、质量以及可能存在的问题,为施工人员提供了重要的决策依据。该系统还能对施工数据进行统计分析,为优化施工流程提供依据,有效提升施工效率和质量。

在广东汕头,一家科技公司紧抓时机,开发出基于北 斗的高精度测量监测系统,具有监测数据自动化处理、 实时报警等功能,解决危房状态自动化监测、桥梁道 路安全监测、建筑工程施工领域安全性鉴定等难题, 有效避免安全事故的发生。

"比如结构已严重损坏或承重构件已属危险构件的危险房屋,随时有可能丧失稳定结构和承载能力,无法保证居住和使用安全。"该公司相关负责人举例表示,

对于危房,可抓住"倒、塌"等较大事故的发生为首要任务,监测系统能够提供建筑倒塌等事故前完整的变形历史数据,真正做到依据可靠数据进行管理,及时采取应对措施。

大型工业构筑物(如通信铁塔、工地塔吊等)作为重要基础设施,其运行状态监测是社会安全发展的基本保障。针对塔形构筑物移位变化监测的困难性以及神功。当一一"大型工业构筑物实时动态安全监测系统,可是一套基于北斗高精度定位全线系统之用"诞生,它是一套基于北斗高精度定位全线系统大量,可以增吊等设备日常运行的健康安全责工的监测系统,评估、预警并实时推送至相关安全责水的技术人员,提升维保部门的工作效率和整体管理水。该系统应用场景广阔,可应用于工地塔吊、危房、该系统应用场景广阔,可应用于工地塔吊、危房、旧楼加装电梯、高层建筑物等行业和领域。

当前,北斗正逐步改变著工程建设的场景和面貌,让 更精准、更安全、更智慧的建设施工更好地惠及民生 福祉。



HKIS EGM on Proposed Amendments to the HKIS Bye-Laws and Rules of Conduct, Ratification of the Rules of Conduct and Election of Honorary Fellows

Proposed Amendments to the HKIS Bye-Laws and Rules of Conduct

Two resolutions were put to the vote of Corporate Members present in person or by proxy and voting at the HKIS Extraordinary General Meeting (EGM) held on 30 August 2023 in the Surveyors Learning Centre.

Amendments to the HKIS Bye-Laws and Rules of Conduct were proposed to introduce a simplified procedure for responding to minor breaches or non-conformities of the Rules of Conduct; additional disciplinary power for the General Council to issue a letter of regret or letter of disapproval; enhanced procedure for the investigation of complaints and conduct of hearings by the Committee of Investigation; and for providing a clearer and prescribed order of procedures on the administrative aspects of the disciplinary bodies to allow a more effective, fair and open system of disciplinary procedures.

Amendments to the HKIS Bye-Laws were also proposed to implement changes to the existing arrangements in the inauguration of the President and the General Council as well as carrying out consequential amendments and textural updating of the provisions in respect of the General Council.

The results of the two resolutions were as follows:-



In memory of Mr Michael Mann

It is with great sorrow that our Past President, Mr Michael Mann, passed away on 23 July 2023 in the United Kingdom. A celebration of Michael's life is scheduled on 18 September at Royal Mid-Surrey Golf Club in the Viscount Room, Richmond, England.

Michael was born in 1944 in Munnar in the state of Kerala, India and after primary school in Munnar he went to Hurstpierpoint College in West Sussex, UK.

In 1968, Michael obtained corporate membership of the Royal Institution of Chartered Surveyors.

Following the appointment by MTRC for Vigers to undertake condition surveys of all buildings along the tunnelling line, Michael relocated to Hong Kong in 1976 to service this consultancy contract. He assembled the team locally and gradually expanded the capabilities to cover other disciplines offering a variety of real estate consultancy services.

In 1998, Michael was awarded Distinguished Building Surveyor in recognition of his invaluable contributions to the profession in Hong Kong.

Having spent 40 years in Hong Kong with his family, Michael and his wife moved back to the UK in 2017.

Road defects are a significant economic burden on the Hong Kong Government due to the city's high vehicle density. Traditional methods of identifying road defects are time-consuming and error-prone with officers in the Highways departments relying on manual identification and recording. To improve the accuracy and efficiency of the road defects identification process, the author proposes a novel approach that combines deep learning detection models with geospatial data analysis.

This dissertation utilises Mask R-CNN, an instance segmentation model that provides class labels, bound boxes, and overlays masks to highlight targets. The characteristics of Mask R-CNN allow for easier differentiation of road defects, enabling the model to detect multiple defects automatically and effectively. Pavement camera images collected by the Highways

Department were used as the main data source, while the author added transfer learning with the MSCOCO dataset and conducted systematic fine-tuning to obtain the optimised hyperparameters for the model. During the fine-tuning process, the author evaluated the performance of the proposed model using various methods including TensorBoard loss curves, mean average precision (mAP), F1 score, the confusion matrix, and pavement camera images.

This dissertation also addresses data insuffciency, imbalance, and weak performance in specific class problems by introducing a hybrid training data augmentation technique that combines ordinary augmentations with a new technique called copy-and-paste augmentation. This technique significantly reduces time costs and improves detection performance. The proposed detection model can identify six common road defects: block cracks, crocodile cracks, potholes, box out spalling, surface spalling, and delaminations. Its weaknesses, such as rounded road marks, stains, and road objects, were filtered out, thereby resulting in a high-quality detection model able to achieve mAP and F1 scores close to 80 percent along a 6.7-km road track on Hong Kong Island with 466 road defects detected in 2,310 images.

For visualisation, the author introduced a semiautomatic workflow to organise road defect information and visualise it on GIS platforms. The workflow stores road defect information in a data frame containing an image's name, class, URL, confidence score, and ground truth coordinates. The author performed visualisation using a point feature map to show the distribution of road defects and employed hot spot analysis to highlight high-risk areas. This workflow could help the Highways Department quickly obtain a comprehensive overview of road defect statistics and distribution.

Overall, the proposed approach, which connects deep learning and geospatial analysis in road defect detection and analysis, could significantly improve the accuracy and efficiency of the traditional method. This dissertation should

provide meaningful insights into addressing road defects in a smart city and could be extended to transfer learning for related projects such as road planning and the construction of road defect warning applications. It can also combine with a 3D view to create digital twins.

VISUALISATION AND DETECTION
OF BUILDING DEFECTS BY
COMBINING THERMOGRAPHY, 3D
MODELLING, AND DEEP LEARNING

Buildings are indispensable structures for humans, as they are built for different needs in people's daily lives. However, building strength eventually degrades over a period of time, especially in Hong Kong, which is a subtropical region with heavy annual precipitation. In such an environment, some defects, such as water leaks and cracks, are common in ageing buildings, which speed up their decline if they do not undergo regular inspections and maintenance.

Water leaks are one of the most common building defects caused by rainwater seeping into wall cracks or via broken water pipes. They can be spotted by infrared thermography because infrared radiant energy varies with temperature, in which case the temperature differences between water-damaged and normal areas can be detected.

Object detection is a computer vision technique for identifying the types and locations of objects in multimedia. Deep learning is considered a more powerful approach than machine learning in object detection because it contains more complicated layered structures called artificial neural networks (ANNs), which are designed to simulate the functions of the human brain in making decisions, problem-solving, perceiving, etc.

This study first performed building defects inspection on a building façade by utilising the high mobility and great coverage of UAVs to capture a set of façade images in both the RGB and thermal bands. Using thermal radiation, the UAVs can spot defects such as water leaks, which tend to have lower temperatures than their surroundings. RGB and thermal mesh models are generated using photogrammetric software and the RGB images are first processed to reconstruct an RGB mesh model for extracting control points to georeference mesh-derived thermal façade orthophotos during the later stages. The combination of thermal facade orthophotos and the RGB 3D mesh model effectively enhances the visualisation of the exact spatial locations of potential defects along a building's façade, which helps inspectors quickly locate potential defects.

The ultimate objective of this study was to combine the use of UAV-borne thermal imaging, 3D modelling, and object detection to detect building defects. It aimed to detect potential water leaks on building façades using the YOLOv5 object detection algorithm. The author examined the feasibility of applying AI to detect building defects during the second part of his study, when he used another set of images called a test set to assess the performance of the custom-trained model, which achieved an average precision of up to 0.830. Finally, based on this custom model, the computer programme successfully detected and labelled the previously-generated thermal façade orthophoto and most potential defects along the façade. Although this technique still had teething problems at the time, the results of this study showed that it is feasible and considerable enough to detect potential building defects by combining thermal imaging, 3D modelling, and deep learning.



Passing of Senior Member Mr Michael R Mann

Past President Mr Michael R Mann passed away on 23 July in the UK. Mike served the BSD for many years and made invaluable contributions to the BS profession by setting up the first-ever BS firm, Vigers, in Hong Kong. Below is his interview extract from 1998, when he was named a Distinguished Building Surveyor.

The BSD offers its deepest sympathies for and heartfelt condolences to Mike's family and expresses its utmost gratitude for his contributions to the profession.



"You must maintain yourself, you must maintain building". Being with buildings for tens of years, Mr. Mann enjoys his work as a Building Surveyor, enjoys working for the institute. I'm honor to be nominated as Distinguished Building Surveyor. Concerning what makes me to become a Distinguished Building Surveyor, I think it is for people to judge why I was nominated, rather than I give the reason."

Life as a Building Surveyor

"From small, I liked architecture. I loved drawing plans. However, it was quite a long course for studying architecture. Knowing that the profession of building survey demanded a shorter period of training. I chose study this subject. In fact, Architects are those who draw plans, while Building Surveyor are those who check plans and make them work".

"Being a Building Surveyor, I could still work with plans and that is what I enjoyed." This is how Mr. Mann became a Building Surveyor. He came from London, and worked for Vigers. Sent by his company, he came to Hong Kong by his own and set the Hong Kong by his own and set the Hong Kong branch. The company looked at full range of surveying, and his job was to check on all buildings that were affected by engineering works.

Work as a Building Surveyor

"To maintain building, we should first inspect the building. Inspection includes not only visual ones, but also by physical means. We Building Surveyors need to go everywhere, from huts to big houses in Central, to inspect houses. I remember that one time we received a complaint from some residents living in the squatters in Diamond Hill who are affected by the shaking effect from a pile driving nearby. Our team went there to inspect. We stood on the first floor, and the whole floor shook so badly that we got out of there immediately. Afterwards, we asked the

person in charge to change and use another type of pile. In another incident, I was locked on the roof and guess how I got down? I just climb down from the scaffoldings!" We must really keep our body fit to work as a Building Surveyor.

Building Surveyor, doctor of the building

In Mr. Mann's eyes, Building Surveyor is the one who finds and cures problems in buildings. "It is a mixture of knowledge, rather than a specialist at any particular area. You got to know a bit of anything, and deal with many different problems. Building Surveyor is a mixture of architect, lawyer and engineer. From large matters to minute ones, like leakage in window, Building Surveyors have to look into it."

Building Surveyor in public's eyes.

"This is quite disappointing that the general public does not know much about this profession. People usually misunderstand Building Surveyor as people conducting survey on land. Some even regards us as property manager, property professional. It is time for HKIS to push more on this division."

"Buildings need maintenance. Buildings are getting old, and more Building Surveyors are needed. So, the area on building maintenance and building management will enlarge. We are all now facing a difficult time, but it will pass."

A few words to students

"Enjoy your study, and get yourself equipped. Working experience would help you a lot, as you will learn more than from textbooks. Maybe the HKIS should encourage firms to employ students for some summer jobs."

OHKF Economic Forum

As HKIS representatives, Sr Joel Teh and I attended the OHKF Economic Forum on "Land Creation and Financing Prospects for Hong Kong's Future" on 23 August at the Hong Kong Convention and Exhibition Centre. The forum brought together prominent scholars, finance industry leaders, and Government officials to address the pressing issue of land shortages in Hong Kong. The assembled experts fostered fruitful discussions and practical strategies to overcome this challenge and pave the way towards a brighter future for their beloved city.

Policy Address 2023

The Government has initiated a public consultation for the Chief Executive's 2023 Policy Address. In mid-August, an e-mail was sent to all GPD members to invite their comments on the address. The insightful responses have allowed the GPD to articulate the collective voice of the surveying profession and it is pleased to share with you the key points that it will submit to the Government:

a. Northern Metropolis and Kau Yi Chau Artificial Islands

The HKIS supports the Government's policy to ensure sustainable and adequate long-term land supply in Hong Kong by developing the Northern Metropolis and Kau Yi Chau Artificial Islands. While comprehensive market studies and land use planning should be undertaken at the earliest opportunity, greater flexibility in land use should be promoted to effectively accommodate future market changes in these new development areas, especially for the San Tin Technopole. Regarding the Kau

Yi Chau Artificial Islands, the Government should provide more information to the public on the related road and railway infrastructure that will be part of the area's improved transportation network rather than solely focusing on the debate over land reclamation.

b. Improvement of Public Infrastructure

The lagging development of public infrastructure has long been a significant obstacle to potential land developments, especially in the New Territories. The Government should continue to adopt an infrastructure-led development approach and prioritise the improvement of smart transport infrastructure in developed areas as much as possible.

For example, the unrealised mass transportation system originally planned for the former Kai Tak runway contradicts the vision and land use pattern of the Kowloon East Masterplan. Property developers and buyers have already made substantial investments in Kai Tak. Therefore, it is crucial to rectify this situation and prioritise the resumption of the mass transportation system to improve accessibility to this area and address the operational problems related to the cruise terminal.

c. Sustainability Development and Blue-Green Assets

The Government proposed upgrading Hong Kong's Blue-Green Assets in "Hong Kong 2030+". While there have been achievements in optimising waterfront areas and improving river channels such as the Tsui Ping and Kai Tak Rivers, there is still room for improvement, particularly in the case of Victoria Harbour, which lacks vitality.

Taking Southern Lantau as an example, the lack of roads and public transport facilities there limits its capacity, while the absence

of high-quality resort hotels affects its tourist offerings. Traffic management and supporting facilities should be enhanced to allow more locals and tourists to enjoy this wonderful resource.

d. Private Development within Village Environs and "V" Zones

The Lands Department typically does not approve land exchange applications for private development (non-small houses) within village environs (VEs). The Government should review its policies to relax land supply restrictions in VEs and consider land exchange applications for private development (excluding small houses) within them. Many private lands within VEs are not owned by indigenous villagers and cannot be practically used for small house development. These idle private lands result in the inefficient utilisation of land resources.

e. Provision of Institutional or Community Facilities in Private Developments

The Government should streamline and expedite the process of obtaining policy support to provide institutional or community facilities (such as residential care homes for the elderly and churches) in private developments. This can be achieved through efficient planning and lease modification applications.

f. Approval Process for GIC and Public Passage Facilities

The Government should streamline the approval process for government, institution, or community (GIC) and public passage facilities in private developments. These facilities are common in Government tender sites and private developments. However, the current process of obtaining approval for such facilities from various Government departments is lengthy and limits new

housing supply. Streamlining the process should include expediting layout and design approvals, clarifying maintenance liability among Government departments, and issuing certificates of completion.

g. Review of the Parameters for Land Premium Assessments

Lease modification and exchange applications are important sources of new land supply from the private sector. The HKIS supports the adoption of "standard rates" premiums for land applications in the New Territories. The Lands Department should review the assessment parameters used in the traditional method of premium assessment to reflect the latest market situation including marketing costs and developers' profits. Timely expert advice on construction costs should be provided by the relevant Government departments to make accurate premium assessments possible.

h. Review of Stamp Duty Arrangements

Hong Kong's residential market has undergone substantial changes in recent months. Demand-side management measures, including Special Stamp Duty (SSD), Buyer's Stamp Duty (BSD), and New Residential Stamp Duty (NRSD), should be reviewed in light of the latest market situation.

i Regular Meetings with Professional Institutes on Streamlining Measures

The HKIS appreciates the Government's efforts to implement various streamlined measures for the development process. It suggests that Government departments hold regular meetings with the relevant professional institutes to gather timely feedback on existing measures and explore the possibility of introducing new measures.

j. Manpower of Professional Government Staff

In addition to promoting streamlining in the development process, the Government should re-examine the workflows its professional staff handle, streamline the manpower requirements of internal professional staff, and consider outsourcing professional work to the private sector when feasible.

Hong Kong-Shanghai Data Cooperation Forum and Open Data Challenge 2023

On 13 August, I was invited to help referee the final assessment of the Hong Kong-Shanghai Open Data Challenge 2023 competition, which was co-organised by the Office of the Government Chief Information Officer of the HKSAR Government and Shanghai Municipal Commission of Economy and Informatization. This event was a follow-up to the fifth (online) meeting of the Hong Kong and Shanghai Cooperation Conference held on 30 August 2021 between two delegations led by the Chief Executive of the HKSAR and Shanghai Mayor Gong Zheng to strengthen cooperation between both cities' big data industries.

The competition encouraged all participants to make the best use of the open data resources in Hong Kong and Shanghai to serve the following objectives:

- Facilitate the exchange of experiences in data technology between talents from Shanghai and Hong Kong through competition, training, and conferences.
- 2) Share the latest developments and future plans for open data in the two cities.
- 3) Showcase best practices in the use of open data in both places and demonstrate how they can help promote smart cities.
- Explore how Hong Kong and Shanghai can more effectively use open data to drive future developments in the digital economy.
- 5) Boost cooperation between both places on open data applications to empower the development of smart cities.
- 6) Promote the data ecosystems of digital businesses in both cities.

The themes of the competition were "Smart Mobility," "Smart Living," "Smart Environment,"

and "Smart Economy" under the six smart areas of the Smart City Blueprint. Each team was allowed to choose one theme. The Shanghai open data can be accessed at the Shanghai Government Data Portal (https://data.sh.gov.cn/), while Hong Kong's open data are available at DATA.GOV.HK (https://data.gov.hk). Contestants were encouraged to use Hong Kong open geospatial data offered by the Common Spatial Data Infrastructure (CSDI) Portal in their entries, as this was a unique advantage of Hong Kong.

The competition attracted over 80 entries, of which 20 (ten from each city) were shortlisted for the final assessment held in Shanghai. A Hong Kong team, the 62_UVent® Smart Ventilation System team working in the Smart Environment category, won the Grand Prize. Its members believed that restaurant kitchen exhaust is a major source of air pollution in urban areas. For their submission, they used GIS and open geospatial data to compare the distribution of air pollution in Hong Kong and Shanghai by analysing their restaurant, convenience store, and public nighttime light distributions.

Following this competition, with Hong Kong's InnoTech Blueprint outlining the city's macro-I&T development goals for the next 5-10 years, including a vigorous promotion of data circulation and applications, it is imperative to build a big data innovation platform to serve both cities and deepen cooperation between their big data industries.

CPD Highlights

Visit to the Q-Leak Underground Water Mains Leak Detection Training Centre



On 29 July, the LSD visited Q-Leak, a centre for underground water mains leak detection established by the Water Supplies Department (WSD). The visit was led by LSD Vice Chairman Sr CHU Siu-ki and HKIS Water Leak Detection Working Committee Chairman Sr KOO Takming. The delegation received a warm welcome from Dr Wallace Lai.





Restricted by the limited space in the lab, Dr Lai was commissioned by the WSD in 2019 to design and build the world's first full-scale training centre of leak detection and diagnosis on Tsing Yi, where a Memorandum of Understanding for teaching, R&D, and public engagement was signed in November 2021.

During the visit, Dr Lai introduced the design and construction of the centre to simulate water leakage of underground pipes of complicated water mains networks. Then he illustrated the types of underground utility records and surveying approaches. After that, he demonstrated new initiatives and developments such as a vehicle-mounted, dual polarised ground penetrating radar (GPR) system; an unmanned GPR-enabled truck; and post-processing and analysis solutions were demonstrated.





The visit successfully concluded after fruitful discussions on the role of land surveying professionals in the underground utility industry, the need for stakeholders to agree on utility survey standards and specifications, and the importance of a centralised UU information platform that can consolidate records from utility stakeholders and can be accessed via need-based applications.

Site Visit to the Hong Kong **Battery Recycling Centre**

Reported by Sr Patrick Leung, **PFMD Council Member**

The PFMD organized a visit to the Hong Kong Battery Recycling Centre at Eco Park, Tuen Mun, on 6 May with a view to gaining an understanding of the entire recycling treatment process that converts lead acid batteries (LABs) into three main components: lead, acid, and plastic.

At the end of an LAB's life cycle (WLAB), it becomes a toxic and corrosive chemical waste and requires proper treatment. Any improper disposal of WLAB can cause long-term damage to rural soil and water systems, particularly in densely-populated cities such as Hong Kong.



Disused Lead Acid Batteries for Recycling

The Hong Kong Battery Recycling Centre Limited (HKBR) is the only battery recycling plant in Hong Kong that provides a complete recycling process from the collection of WLABs to their conversion into something else. Its state-of-the-art technology ensures a safe, efficient, and environmentally-friendly solution to Hong Kong's trash disposal problem, but requires strict compliance with local laws. Currently, the HKBR has difficulty in collecting WLABs from the market, so further incentives, including Government subsidies, should be explored to encourage more collections from different suppliers.



Lead Recycled from Lead Acid Batteries

As Hong Kong's economy continues to decarbonise, local recycling efforts should be given priority to eliminate the city's excess carbon footprint rather than exporting the WLABs abroad. Besides, the conversion of toxic waste into reusable materials is essential to Hong Kong's sustainable development. In terms of ESG (environment, sustainability, and governance), it should be for the long run.

Defamation on Facility Management and Property Management Operation in Hong Kong

A joint CPD with the Hong Kong Institute of Facility Management (HKIFM) was held on 12 May at the Surveyors Learning Centre with solicitor Mr KY Kwok.

Defamatory statements are "words that tend to lower the plaintiff in the estimation of rightthinking members of society generally". This

statement may also be defamatory if it causes the plaintiff to be "shunned or avoided" or when it is calculated to hold the plaintiff up to "hatred, contempt, or ridicule". Living persons and corporations (including incorporated owners under the Building Management Ordinance), trade unions, etc, can sue for defamation.

A plaintiff may have a claim against anyone participating in the chain of publication of a defamatory statement including the author/speaker of the statement and anyone involved in its distribution, even if the last is just a messenger.

Mr Kwok shared his view on the following subtopics:

- 1 Overview of Defamation
- 2 Usual Defences against Defamation in the Building Management Context
- 3 Analysis of Decided Cases and Some Actual Case Scenarios and Points to Note by Facility and Property Managers

Mr Kwok also discussed an individual's liability for handling any complaint of defamation, quoted legal judgements by the court, and shared his experiences with legal cases.

The PFMD showed its appreciation for Mr Kwok's presentation with a souvenir. PFMD hopes that he will return to share more legal developments related to property management practices in the future.

On 29 July, thirty QSD and BSD members visited the Hong Kong Housing Society's (HKHS) construction site at Phase 1A Hung Shui Kiu the first-ever Subsidised Sale Flats project of the HKHS built with modular integrated construction

Phase IA, 29 July 2023

(MiC) concrete modules and scheduled for completion in 2024. The main contractor is Yau Lee Construction Co, Ltd, which built the firstever concrete MiC project in Hong Kong.

HKHS Director (Projects) Sr Franki Yeung briefed the visitors on the scope of the project, its timeline, and the particular arrangements in the design and installation of its MiC modules. Yau Lee Executive Director Ms Rosana Wong highlighted the function of the BEANIE digital platform, which provides online monitoring of the design, production, quality control, transportation, and installation process of the modules. BIM and Blockchain technologies have also been applied to this project.

Earlier, in June, the same HKIS delegation visited the Yau Lee MiC production factory in Huizhou and caught a MiC module on a truck that was about to travel to the Hung Shui Kiu site. BEANIE can pinpoint the location of this module within the building block.



Experience Sharing on Application of Fire Safety Codes and Ordinances

The CPD, "Experience-Sharing on the Application of Fire Safety Codes and Ordinances," was successfully held on 17 August for over 100 young professionals and probationers.

Sr Stephen Tse Siu Ming started off by introducing the underlying principles of fire safety in buildings, followed by a comparison of the Code of Practice for Fire Safety in Buildings 2011 and previous enactments. Aside from the FS Code, Stephen also delved into the general application of the Fire Safety (Buildings) Ordinance and shared the difficulties and challenges he encountered on the job.







Holding Temporary Events with Temporary Structures: Experience-Sharing on Temporary Places of Public Entertainment Licence Applications (25 August 2023)

YSG happily extended an invitation to Sr Ben WH Chong, the current District Authorised

Person at the Cultural District Authority and previously the Chief Building Surveyor at the Buildings Department, to share his expertise regarding applications for Temporary Places of Public Entertainment Licence. This CPD attracted nearly 130 practitioners and student members from diverse disciplines.

Ben graciously explained the primary objective of the Places of Public Entertainment Ordinance (Cap 172) and shared how the licence has helped ensure public safety and maintain order at public venues. Notably, when temporary structures are integrated into a venue, compliance with the standards of building safety, fire safety, hygiene, and crowd control is mandatory. By using a variety of illustrative photos, Ben shared his invaluable experiences with licence applications for permanent arts and cultural venues to host temporary events. This boosted the understanding of the younger members in attendance.

The CPD attracted positive feedback and an enthusiastic reception from the audience. YSG greatly values Ben's expertise and looks forward to inviting him back to further enlighten our members, particularly in the areas of new building development and building controls, and facilitate more knowledge exchanges.

The Course & the Tour

The course, known as the "Course on National" Affairs" (國情班), has often faced criticism. However, during my seven-day study at Tsinghua University, I was pleasantly surprised by the enlightening instruction provided by different professors. They covered various topics such as history, politics, international affairs, architecture, and technology, all of which offered a comprehensive understanding of the Mainland from different fields.

What struck me the most was the profound knowledge and humility that the professors exhibited. Despite being top-level experts in their respective fields, they remained open-minded and approachable. They even welcomed their students' questions and engaged in meaningful interactions with them to better understand their perspectives.

Two viewpoints from the lectures left a lasting impression on me. The first came during the lecture on the "Fourteenth Five-Year Plan for the National Economic and Social Development and the Long-Range Objectives through the Year 2035". The professor highlighted the

evolving global situation and predicted that the United States would not be the world's only leading nation by 2035, by which time the Mainland would share that position. As a major part of the Mainland's national plans, Hong Kong should leverage its inherent advantages, such as language skills and international exposure, to maintain its role as the Mainland's window to the world.

Another noteworthy aspect, which was discussed during the architectural history lecture, pertained to modern architecture. It has become evident that many building designs incorporate Chinese-style ornaments, but there is still little development of a distinct architectural concept in the Mainland. This has raised concerns over the potential loss of the country's architectural identity. The need to create a new architectural language rooted in traditional Chinese architecture is significant for all stakeholders in the Mainland's construction industry. Addressing this matter necessitates collective engagement and exploration to preserve and invigorate the country's architectural heritage.

Outside the Tsinghua campus, students visited some famous Beijing sites such as the Forbidden City, National Museum of the Mainland, Palace Museum, and a new mega metro station development – the Beijing Sub-Center Railway Station. Beijing was a good example of a city with a past and a future.
