

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE 會長的話

o, ho, ho, seasonal dinner events made welcome returns this festive month, like the Hong Kong Institute of Project Management Annual Dinner on 30 November, the Hong Kong Institute of Certified Public Accountants 50th Anniversary Gala Dinner on 4 December, and the 31st Anniversary of the Asia Pacific Interior Design Awards Presentation-cum-Gala Dinner on 14 December. I was with young surveying graduates of the Hong Kong Institute of Construction at their joyous graduation ceremony on 30 November and attended the Executive Council Monthly Thursday Luncheon on 14 December.

Close dialogue and liaison with Government

Our bold move this year to engage earlier with government departments paid dividends. We met key officials and department representatives and established dialogues and links almost every month. I am impressed with how many senior people engaged this month. On 29 November, there was a casual meeting with Under Secretary for Development Mr David Lam, JP to discuss the streamlining procedure and approval process for general building plan submissions and associated issues in a

continuing effort to expedite the development process.

I was joined by Honorary Secretary Sr Raymond Kam for an exchange session on the Policy Address 2023 with Secretary for Development Ms Bernadette Linn, JP on 4 December. The next day, I was at the HKIS Drinks Gathering with the Director of Housing, Miss Rosanna Law, JP, on the 6th received a courtesy visit by the Commissioner for the Belt and Road Office (BRO), Mr Nicholas Ho, to the HKIS and on the 8th attended the BRO Talk E-commerce Opportunities Thailand and Construction Industry Council—See What I See Luncheon on the topic of "Housing for the Future". I was at the Celebration Ceremony for the Housing Authority's 50th Anniversary on 12 December, at which the Chief Executive, Mr John Lee Ka-chiu, and officials spoke about Authority milestones and successes.

On 15 December, the Institute met Financial Secretary Mr Paul Chan Mo-po, JP and mentioned our proposed initiatives and enhancing measures for surveying courses and graduates. He pledged to support the HKIS 40th anniversary events next year and the International Valuation Standards Council Hong Kong Conference, which the Institute will organise in November 2024.

The Architectural, Surveying, Planning and Landscape (ASPL) sectors met the Secretary for Education, Dr Christine Choi Yuk-lin, JP, and representatives from the University Grants Committee on 11 December to discuss the manpower shortage. We requested greater funding for the universities to put towards more

subsidised ASPL places. A week later, the HKIS reiterated this stand in a casual meeting with the Development Bureau concerning surveying manpower and government surveying courses. Led by Principal Assistant Secretary (Works) Mrs Susanne Wong, the discussions involved 14 HKIS representatives and included the proposals we put to the Financial Secretary, as well as manpower initiatives launched this year, such as job fairs in the Mainland and facilitating immigration through smoother visa application processes and importation schemes for technicians.

Mainland connection

The Institute works constantly to collaborate more closely with the Mainland. With new Divisional chairpersons coming on board, the Institute arranged a dinner on 11 December to introduce them to officials of the Central Liaison Office.

My video-recorded speech on innovation was played at the Guangdong-Hong Kong-Macao Bay Area Management Innovation Summit on 7 December. It was also my pleasure to welcome leaders from the Guangzhou Nansha Economic and Technological Development Zone Investment Promotion Bureau to the HKIS on 14 December. They promoted the zone's robust economy and invited the HKIS and members to establish presences there.

On 13 December, the HKIS was pleased to welcome a delegation from the Inner Mongolia Autonomous Region Construction Engineering Association. It was the Association's first Hong Kong visit and the 12 ambassadors paved the way for future collaborations.

To great fanfare, the HKIS opened its Shanghai contact point on 21 December. Heavyweight councillors, guests and government officials from Shanghai, Hong Kong and Shenzhen attended the official inauguration at a plaque unveiling in the Xuhui Shanghai Hong Kong Innovation and Entrepreneurship Centre. The Institute took up the office on an invitation from the Shanghai Xuhui District Chinese Overseas Friendship Association. The HKIS is the first Hong Kong statutory professional body to open a Shanghai contact point, our second in the Mainland after Beijing office. We hope this brand-new event and exchange platform will foster better relations and provide more opportunities for surveying companies and professionals. I was pleased to sign a memorandum of understanding (MOU) there with the Shanghai Construction Consultants Trade Association, strengthening our communications, cooperation and exchanges through activities like academic seminars and training. This twoin-one event marked a new milestone for us in Shanghai and ended our year on a high note.

The Institute also signed MOUs with counterparts in Beijing, on 29 November, Shenzhen, on 2 December, and Qianhai of Shenzhen, on 29 December.

Keeping abreast of industry developments

I attended several Continuing Professional Development programmes this month. On 16 December, the GPD and PDD jointly ran a two-hour visit to a soon-to-open Transitional Housing scheme in Wong Tai Sin. Experts led the guided walk pointing out key aspects of the project,

in particular its vibrant and colourful design and innovative construction. A 90-minute QSD talk on 29 November covered the balance for countryside conservation, which is critically determined by the trio of government, community and local villagers.

A visit to a nursery, organised on 9 December by our QSD and the Hong Kong Institute of Landscape Architects, introduced members to various plant species, some rare, and instructed them on their classification and how to maintain transplanted trees.

On 7 December, the Institute's BIM Round Table Forum 2023 drew industrial professionals to Tai Kwun to share their views on digitalisation. At the first Institute of International Experts meeting on 19 December, its chairman and council members presented their mission, aims and achievements, while exploring views on potential areas of collaboration for the good of both institutes.

Key achievements

In this, my final President's message, I look back on a very busy, challenging and rewarding year. With the Institute's Council year ending, let me highlight key accomplishments.

Engaging young surveyors

One of my missions was to involve the Young Surveyors Group more deeply in the Institute and its activities: I am delighted to report stronger communications with the Group and young members and more opportunities for them to contribute. Our talented and energetic young

members were involved in various projects and initiatives, such as the Civil Engineering and Development Department's Working Groups for Kau Yi Chau Artificial Islands and a dialogue with the Secretary for Housing, Ms Winnie Ho, JP. I was delighted to see them take part in many things, such as dragon boat races, study tours, and a series of talks called the "Young Leader Series: Empowering Our Next Generation of Leaders".

Public recognition

As a trusted and respected partner of the Government in promoting sustainable development in Hong Kong, the HKIS this year worked hard. We held two press conferences, issued 29 press releases, and met officials of Government bureaux and departments, and quasi- and non-governmental organisations. We advised and gave feedback on the Policy Address, the Budget, Kau Yi Chau Artificial Islands Project, Northern Metropolis, building safety, site safety and the talent list-among many important issues—through briefing sessions, symposiums and written submissions. We also improved our media ties to better get our messages and opinions out to the public. We gave luncheons and interviews to media outlets, while also expressing our views through Op-Ed columns.

Through organising conferences by our Divisions, this provides a valuable platform to exchange knowledge and ideas among members and industry practitioners. The Institute also participated in local, Mainland and international conferences, forums and meetings.

Promoting surveying

We spared no effort in raising surveying in the public consciousness, especially in cultivating the next generation through activities like the "Create Your District" Competition, career talks, media interviews, and taking part in youth programmes such as the Strive and Rise Programme, mentorships and work experience schemes in partnership with other NGOs and Government departments. Our scholarships and awards acknowledged outstanding students: at the HKIS Scholarship Presentation Ceremony last July alone, we presented 61 scholarships and awards.

In addition to career talk ambassadors, we are working on a social media campaign that includes a promotional video, as well as online and offline campaigns targeting secondary school students.

Mainland and international cooperation

The HKIS has continued to promote and facilitate cross-border surveying co-operation. I led delegations to Beijing and Shanghai in June and August, for the first time since the COVID-19 pandemic in order to reconnect with authorities and organisations and discuss the latest developments and trends in Mainland surveying. At the same time, we were excited to welcome our Mainland counterparts from Foshan, Shenzhen, Beijing, Nansha and Inner Mongolia, among others, to our office for exchanges.

Apart from CPD events, hybrid seminars and site visits organised by the Beijing, Guangzhou

and Shanghai Forums, the Institute has acted as a bridge between its members and the different Government departments of both Hong Kong and the Mainland by organising seminars, exploring favourable circumstances for surveyors to practice, and opportunities in the Mainland, especially in the Greater Bay Area.

We broadened our global presence by raising our colours at events like the FIG Working Week in the United States and the PAQS Congress in Malaysia, while strengthening ties with overseas organisations by welcoming them to Hong Kong, like the Chartered Institution of Civil Engineering Surveyors and the Chartered Association of Building Engineers.

Final wishes

My heartfelt congratulations to my successor, Sr Francis Lam, who was elected at the 15 December AGM

Finally, my sincere thanks to our members, all Office Bearers, members of the General Council, Divisions, Boards, YSG, panels, committees, task forces, working groups and secretariat officers for their hard work and support.

慶晚宴活動在這個普天同慶的月份再度 舉辦,包括 11 月 30 日舉行的香港項目 管理學會周年晚宴、12 月 4 日舉行的 香港會計師公會 50 周年晚宴,以及 12 月 14 日 舉行的第 31 屆亞太區室內設計大獎頒獎典禮暨晚 宴。11 月 30 日,我與香港建造學院年輕測量學 畢業生一起參加了歡樂的畢業典禮,並於 12 月 14 日出席了行政會議每月星期四午餐例會。

與政府密切對話及聯繫

今年,我們積極地與政府部門提前接觸,此舉已 見成效。我們幾乎每個月都會與主要官員和部門 代表會面,並建立對話和聯繫。每一次的交流會 談,都讓我獲益良多。11月29日,我們與發展 局副局長林智文先生,JP討論簡化提交一般建 築圖則的程序和相關事項,以致力持續加快發展 進程。

12月4日,本人偕同義務秘書甘家輝測量師與發展局局長甯漢豪女士,JP一同參加 2023 年施政報告交流會。翌日,我在香港測量師學會舉辦的聚會和房屋署署長羅淑佩女士,JP 聚首。12月6日,我代表學會接待了「一帶一路」專員何力治先生,並在12月8日出席以「泰國電子商貿機遇」為主題的「BRO Talk」講座,以及由建造業議會舉辦的「香港建造新視野」午宴。12月12日,我獲邀參加香港房屋委員會成立50周年慶典,當日行政長官李家超先生和各官員在慶典上,談到房委會開創的里程碑和多年成就。

12月15日,學會代表與財政司司長陳茂波先生,JP 會面,提及對測量學課程的建議和畢業生的支援 措施。司長承諾支持本會明年的40周年活動, 以及將於 11 月舉辦的國際評估準則理事會香港會 議。

12月11日,建測規園界代表與教育局局長蔡若蓮女士,JP及大學教育資助委員會代表會面,討論人手不足的問題。我們請求大學增加撥款,一星期後,香港測量師學會在與發展局的非正式會議上重申這一立場,是次會議由首席助理秘書長(工務)黃何詠詩女士主持,議題圍繞測量界人手安排及政府測量課程。當日共有14名香港測量師學會的代表參加,討論內容涵蓋我們早前向財政司司長提出的建議,以及今年推出的人才措施,例如在內地舉行招聘會,並透過更簡易的簽證申請程序與輸入技術人員計劃來鼓勵移民、吸納專才。

與內地連通

學會一直致力與內地建立更緊密的合作關係。隨 著本會新一屆的專業組別主席上任,學會於 12 月 11 日安排了一場晚宴,向中聯辦官員作介紹。

12月7日,粵港澳大灣區管理創新高峰論壇上播放了我就創新主題錄製的演講影片。12月14日,我很榮幸,能夠接待廣州南沙經濟技術開發區投資促進局的領導,到訪香港測量師學會,他們向學會代表介紹了南沙的蓬勃經濟狀況,並邀請香港測量師學會及會員在當地設立辦事處。

12月13日,香港測量師學會有幸接待內蒙古自 治區工程建設協會代表團一行。這是該協會首 次訪港,12位代表的蒞臨為未來的合作奠定了 基礎。

12月21日,香港測量師學會上海聯絡點正式成 立,來自滬港深三地的重量級議員、嘉賓和政府 官員一同出席在徐匯滬港創新創業交流中心舉行 的授牌儀式。應上海市徐匯區海外聯誼會的邀 請,學會在上海設立了聯絡辦事處。香港測量師 學會是首個在上海市設立聯絡點的香港法定專業 團體,這也是學會繼北京之後在中國內地設立的 第二個聯絡點。我們希望這個全新的活動和交流 平台能夠為測量企業和專業人士建立更密切的關 係,帶來更多機遇。同時,我很高興與上海市建 設工程諮詢行業協會簽署合作備忘錄,透過學術 研討會和培訓等活動加強雙方的溝通、合作與交 流。此次二合一盛事標誌著我們在上海的一個新 里程碑, 並為我們今年的工作畫上圓滿的句號。 學會亦已分別於 12 月 29 日在深圳前海、11 月 29 日在北京和 12 月 2 日在深圳與同業簽署了合 作備忘錄。

掌握行業最新動態

本月我參加了多個持續專業發展項目。12月16 日,產業測量組與規劃及發展組聯合舉辦一個為 時兩小時的考察活動,參觀了黃大仙一個即將投 入使用的過渡性房屋計劃。一眾專家在導覽過程 中為我們介紹項目的特色,尤其是當中充滿活力 的多彩設計和創新的建造方式。11月29日,工 料測量組舉辦了一場 90 分鐘的講座,內容關於鄉 郊保育的平衡之道,政府、社區和當地村民之間 的三方合作是實現平衡的關鍵所在。

12月9日,工料測量組與香港園境師學會聯合舉 辦一場苗圃參觀活動,向會員介紹不同植物品種, 其中不乏稀有植物,同時指導他們如何分類及護 養移植的樹木。

12月7日,學會主辦的「建築信息模擬 (BIM) 圓 桌論壇 2023」吸引業界專業人士齊集大館,分享 數碼化對建造界影響。在12月19日舉行的國際 專家學會首次會議上,學會主席和理事會成員介 紹了他們的使命、目標和成就,並探討了對學會 雙方均有利的潛在合作領域。

主要成就

這是我最後一次發表會長的話,希望藉此回顧過 去極其繁忙、充滿挑戰和碩果纍纍的一年。隨著 學會理事會年度的結束,請容許我重點回顧一下 一些主要成就。

吸引年輕測量師參與

會長的使命,是積極推動年輕會員參與活動和促 進更緊密的溝通。這群優秀且充滿活力的青年會 員在本年度參與了多項計劃和活動,例如土木工 程拓展署的交椅洲人工島工作小組,以及與房屋 局局長何永賢女士, JP 的對話。我很高興看到他 們積極參與其他活動,例如龍舟賽、考察團和「青 年領袖對話系列:培育未來領袖 (Young Leader Series: Empowering Our Next Generation of Leaders)」系列講座。

提高公眾認同

在推動香港可持續發展方面,本會一直是政府的 重要合作夥伴,香港測量師學會今年付出了不少 努力。本屆一共舉行了兩次記者招待會,發布了 29 份新聞稿,並與政府決策局及部門、半官方及 非政府機構的要員會面。我們透過簡報會、座談 會和書面意見,就《施政報告》、《財政預算案》、

交椅洲人工島計劃、北部都會區、樓宇安全、工 地安全和人才清單等眾多重要議題提供意見和回 饋。此外,我們亦加強與媒體的聯繫,以便向公 眾更清晰地傳達學會的訊息和觀點。除了舉辦傳 媒午宴,我們還接受媒體採訪,並透過觀點社論 專欄表達意見。

各專業組別舉辦的年度會議為會員和業界人士提供一個交流專業知識和觀點的重要平台。此外, 學會亦有參與本地、內地及國際舉辦的會議、論 增和會面。

推廣測量工作

我們不遺餘力地提高公眾對測量工作的認識,特別是透過舉辦「構建『你』想北部都會區」創作比賽、職業講座、媒體訪談等活動,以及參與「共創明『Teen』計劃」、友師計劃,還有與其他非政府組織和政府部門合作舉行的工作體驗計劃等青少年項目,務求致力培育未來一代。我們的獎學金和獎項旨在表揚優秀學生:單單在7月舉行的香港測量師學會獎學金頒獎典禮上,我們就頒發了61個獎學金及獎項。

除了職業講座大使,我們即將在社交媒體上開展 推廣活動,包括宣傳影片以及面向中學生的網上 和線下活動。

與內地和國際的合作

香港測量師學會持續推動及促進跨境測量方面的 合作。疫情結束後,我於6月及8月首次率領代 表團到訪北京和上海,與內地有關當局和機構重 新建立聯繫,並討論內地測量業的最新發展和趨 勢。同時,我們對於來自佛山、深圳、北京、南 沙和內蒙古等地的內地同行蒞臨學會辦事處進行 交流,感到由衷的高興。

除了由北京、廣州及上海論壇舉辦的持續專業發展項目、混合式研討會和實地考察,學會亦擔當會員與香港及內地不同政府部門之間的橋樑,舉辦研討會、探討對測量師執業的有利環境及內地的發展機會,特別是在大灣區。

我們在美國的國際測量師聯合會(FIG)工作週和 馬來西亞的亞太區工料測量師協會(PAQS)大會 等活動中表現出色,增強國際影響力,同時接待 訪港的英國特許土木工程測量師學會和英國特許 建築工程師學會等海外組織,藉此加強與國際組 織的聯繫。

最後的祝願

我衷心祝賀在 12 月 15 日周年大會上獲選的下任 會長林家輝測量師。

最後,我由衷感謝我們的會員、所有執行理事、 理事會成員、專業組別、委員會、青年組、小組、 一眾委員會、專案小組、工作小組和秘書處所有 成員一直以來的付出和支持。

Redevelopment to Solve Issues of Ageing Buildings

It is estimated that within five years, the number of old and dilapidated buildings aged 50 or above in Hong Kong would exceed 10,000, resulting in urgent needs for redevelopment and rehabilitation. The government considers redevelopment to be the more practical option, due to effectiveness in tackling safety issues. Nevertheless, renewal brings about potential issues of decanting and conservation. Also, there are policy and technical issues to be sorted out. Assuming important roles in the process, surveyors contribute to solving issues related to redevelopment.

A survey by the Urban Renewal Authority (URA) shows that 400 of the 9,600 private buildings aged 50 or above at the end of 2022 are beyond economic repairs. Whereas the number of private buildings aged 50 or above will increase by around 620 per year in the next decade, past data shows that only 160 were demolished for redevelopment per annum.

To expedite redevelopment, the government encourages both the public and private sectors to carry out urban renewal. The Housing Authority and the Housing Society redevelop aged public rental housing. The Urban Renewal Authority has been acquiring privately owned ageing properties. Private developers play key roles in redevelopment since in the past 10 years, 75 per cent of new flats from all redevelopment projects came from private development projects.

Upcoming redevelopment efforts

Sr Kam-kuen Chiu, Chairman of HKIS' Housing Policy Panel, highlighted major renewal projects by the Urban Renewal Authority. For instance, two projects in Kowloon City (Kai Tak Road/Sa Po Road; Shing Tak Street / Ma Tau Chung Road) and one in Kwun Tong (Town Centre Development Areas 4 and 5) are estimated to result in 3,200 new private residential units in total.

In the public sector, there are nine public housing estates under the Housing Authority that have exceeded 50 years. Among them, Choi Hung, Ma Tau Wai, Wah Fu (first and second phases), Sai Wan, and Wong Tai Sin estates will be redeveloped. New public housing in Kwun Tong (Wang Chiu Road) and Wong Tai Sin, both expected to be ready around 2025 to 2026, could help to bear part of the burden for decanting of residents.

Surveyors' roles throughout redevelopment cycle

Surveyors play significant roles in redevelopment. During planning stage, Planning and Development Surveyors (PD) are responsible for strategic planning and development. During land acquisition stage, General Practice Surveyors (GP) in government departments formulate terms of compensation and clauses for new land leases. GPs who work for private developers, investors and consulting firms keep property sellers and buyers informed about government policies and market trends. They do valuation and estimate compensation. In the case of disputes in compulsory sale, GPs can act on behalf of developers or parties acquiring land as well as owners whose properties are being acquired at the Lands Tribunal. GPs may act as Members of the Tribunal to sit in hearing cases.

To facilitate compensation assessment, Land Surveyors (LS) deal with site boundary delineation and area confirmation especially for sites situated in the rural areas. Quantity Surveyors (QS) manage construction cost during building stage.

Building Surveyors (BS) on the other hand, via maintenance and inspection, help to reduce the speed of deterioration and prolong life span of existing buildings, so that redevelopment can be postponed and the burden slightly alleviated. URA has recommended the setting

up of maintenance sinking fund, coming from a proportion of the monthly property management fee of buildings, to support comprehensive maintenance plan.

Solving issues related to redevelopment

Urban renewal may bring opportunities as well threats to stakeholders. While some are glad to relocate, others may be dissatisfied with compensation while trying hard to stay in adjacent areas. How do surveyors help to strike a balance?

Sr Chiu stated, "Surveyors tackle the issues from a fair and just perspective. We estimate property value based on market value, given that both buyers and sellers understand the market. We try to balance interests among the government, owners, residents, and developers. We also strike a balance between redevelopment and building maintenance. The HKIS reflects opinions of stakeholders to the government in the hope of creating an equilibrium."

Sr Andrew Chan, Chairman of the HKIS General Practice Division, added that surveyors are third-party consultants to ensure transparency, fairness and justice during transactions. "Regarding price negotiations, some minority owners may feel that they are not on equal grounds with developers. Surveyors help to provide information and settle disputes."

In the Policy Address 2023, it is proposed that a dedicated office be set up to provide one-stop support services to minority owners affected by compulsory sale. Both Sr Chiu and Sr Chan believe that surveyors will contribute to these supporting services to ensure communication between minority owners and other stakeholders during acquisition. Lists of surveying firms are also available to facilitate owners who are seeking consultation from surveyors.

Apart from compensation, there are policy issues to be solved. Sr Chan noted the HKIS has proposed to the government that compulsory sale application thresholds be lowered to facilitate urban renewal. Further to this being announced at the Policy Address in October, on 19 December the Development Bureau published the Land (Compulsory Sale for Redevelopment) (Amendment) Bill 2023 to expedite the consolidation of property interests and enhance protection of minority interests. Specifically, the Bill reduces the thresholds for private buildings aged 50 or above, from the existing 80 per cent to 70 per cent or 65 per cent, depending on the age and location of buildings.

Surveyors have always supported that land premium be charged at standard rates for redevelopment of industrial buildings, and that standard rates be extended to agricultural lands in the New Territories. This has been accepted by the Chief Executive in his Policy Address.

As to potential issues regarding decanting and replacement, Sr Chiu believes that developments in Kau Yi Island and the Northern Metropolis should be done as soon as possible to house those affected by redevelopment. "It would be desirable if people affected can move to buildings in the same district. However, this cannot ensured due to high density in urban areas. In the case that they have to move to other areas, the government can consider giving out compensations. Generally speaking however, most areas in Hong Kong are highly accessible. It is necessary to strike a balance for benefits of the society as a whole."

Whereas some may be concerned about heritage conservation, Sr Chiu referred to the government's preservation efforts in Mongkok, Yau Ma Tei and Tsim Sha Tsui, with Yau Ma Tei being the heart of the proposed Cultural Belt. To preserve sites with historic value, plot ratio has been transferred to another site within the

same district. Also, in the renewal of Kowloon City's 'Lung Shing' area (Nga Tsin Wai Road / Carpenter Road), the URA has adopted an integrated approach combining redevelopment, rehabilitation, preservation and revitalisation so as to retain characteristics of small on-street shops, Chiu Chau and Thai restaurants, as well as ensure space for greeneries and government, institutional and community (GIC) facilities.

Sr Chan elaborated on the Northern Metropolis to explicate conservation of the environment during development. "Having set up a Wetland Conservation Parks System, the government is exploring the preservation of fish ponds, agricultural land, ecological environment and modernised aquaculture and fisheries practices." He believes projects should observe the principles of Environment, Social and Governance (ESG).

Rights of the needy will not be sacrificed during redevelopment, as requirements for GIC facilities have been incorporated into land lease. In the urban renewal project for Kowloon City (Kai Tak Road / Sha Po Road) for instance, a Children Care Centre will be provided.

Concerns as market weakens

Sr Chun-kong Lau, Chairman of HKIS' Land Policy Panel, believes that urban renewal has been well received in Hong Kong. The Urban Renewal Authority, when acquiring owner-occupied domestic properties by offering the market value plus Home Purchase Allowance based on value of a seven-year-old flat in a comparable quality building in a similar locality, gives better offers in many occasions (but not always) when compared with compulsory sale. Apart from improving living conditions and surrounding environment, urban

renewal introduces new buildings into old districts, which in turn attract young residents and visitors to old districts such as Sham Shui Po. With the construction of new buildings, age-friendly designs are introduced to provide better conditions for the elderly and physically challenged. Urban renewal has also taken into consideration conservation of old buildings including such projects at Yuen Ngai Street/Prince Edward Road West and Shanghai Street area near Langham Place in Mongkok.

Sr Lau speaks positively about the Policy Address' proposals to enhance URA's financial capability, lower compulsory sale application thresholds, charge land premium at standard rates for redevelopment of industrial buildings and extend the standard rates practice to more agricultural land in the New Territories, and set up dedicated office to provide one-stop support services to minority owners affected by compulsory sale. He believes the government is enthusiastically encouraging urban renewal. Nevertheless, he is concerned that as land and property prices drop and the market weakens, developers will be less motivated to engage in redevelopment.



重建發展 解決樓宇老化問題

香港老舊樓宇日漸增多,估計未來五年,老舊以及日久失修、樓齡 50 年或以上的樓宇數目將會超過一萬幢,令重建和復修的迫切性急增。政府認為重建更能有效處理樓宇安全問題;與此同時,重建帶來調遷及保育的潛在問題,亦需要解決政策和技術問題。測量師在重建過程中擔當重要角色,協助解決相關問題。

市區重建局(市建局)的一項調查指出,2022 年年底樓齡 50 年或以上的私人樓宇約有 9,600 幢,當中約 400 幢的維修不合乎成本效益。而在未來十年,樓齡 50 年或以上的私人樓宇將每年增加約 620 幢,過往數據亦顯示每年因重建而清拆的私人樓宇只有約 160 幢。

為加快重建速度,政府鼓勵公營及私營機構一同落實市區重建項目。房屋委員會(房委會)和房屋協會(房協)重建高齡屋邨;市建局收購私人擁有的老化物業。過去10年,發展商在市區重建上扮演重要角色,全港重建項目中的七成半新落成單位均來自私人發展項目。

未來的重建計劃

香港測量師學會房屋政策小組主席趙錦權測量師指出市建局其中數個主要項目,包括九龍城兩個項目(啟德道/沙浦道;盛德街/馬頭涌道)和觀塘一個項目(市中心第4及第5發展區),估計合共提供3,200個新的私人住宅單位。

在公營房屋方面,房委轄下九個公共屋邨的樓齡超過50年,當中彩虹、馬頭圍、華富(一、二邨)、

西環和黃大仙將被重建。由於位處觀塘(宏照道) 和黃大仙的新公屋預計於 2025 至 2026 年落成, 將可協助安置部分因重建而等候調遷的居民。

測量師的角色

測量師在重建項目上肩負重要角色。在規劃階段,規劃及發展測量師負責策略性規劃與發展。在徵用土地階段,政府部門的產業測量師制定賠償條款和新批土地條款。至於為發展商、投資者與顧問公司工作的產業測量師,則向買賣雙方提供有關政府政策和市場趨勢等資訊,並負責估價和測算賠償金額。如在強拍過程中出現糾紛,產業測量師可以在土地審裁處代表收購方或物業被收購的業主。另外,他們可以擔任審裁處成員出席聆訊,協助審理案件。

土地測量師在地價補償的程序中,尤其涉及鄉郊 地段土地,負責劃定地界及釐定面積範圍;而工 料測量師則在建設階段負責管控建築成本。

另外,建築測量師透過維修和檢驗,協助減慢現存樓宇折舊速度、延長其壽命,延後對重建的迫切需求。市建局建議成立維修儲備金,在每月的管理費中撥出一定比例以支援整全的維修計劃。

解決重建相關問題

對持分者來說,市區重建有危亦有機。部分居民樂於調遷,部分則可能不滿意賠償額,並希望留在原區。測量師如何協助取得平衡?

趙錦權測量師指出:「測量師本著公平、公正的 宗旨處理問題。在買賣雙方充分理解的情況下, 按市場價格為物業進行估值。我們嘗試平衡政府、 業主、住客、發展商之間的利益,同時也在重建 與樓宇維修之間權衡利弊。香港測量師學會向政 府反映持分者的意見,希望建立平衡點。」

產業測量組主席陳家輝測量師補充,測量師作為 第三方顧問,確保交易過程透明、公平和公正。 「部分小業主或許認為自己的議價能力跟發展商 有差異,測量師可協助提供資訊和排解糾紛。」

2023 年施政報告提議成立專責辦事處,向受強拍 影響的小業主提供一站式支援服務。趙錦權測量 師和陳家輝測量師均認為,測量師將可提供這些 支援服務,在收購過程中促進小業主和其他持分 者之間的溝通。學會可提供測量公司名單,方便 業主尋求測量諮詢服務。

除了賠償以外,政策問題亦有待解決。陳家輝測 量師指出,學會已向政府提議放寬強拍門檻,以 加快舊區重建。此建議於今年的施政報告被採納, 並已在 10 月公佈。 12 月 19 日,發展局更進一 步公佈《2023年土地(為重新發展而強制售賣) (修訂)條例草案》,加快私人業權統一及加強 保障小業主利益。具體而言,視乎樓齡組別及樓 宇地點而定,《條例草案》將樓齡達 50 年或以上 私人樓宇的強拍門檻由現時的80%降至70%或 65% °

測量師業界一直支持工廈重建以標準金額方式補 地價,並將標準金額擴展至新界農地。這些建議 已被特首施政報告採納。

至於調遷與重置安排,趙錦權測量師希望交椅洲 人工島和北部都會區發展計劃盡快完成,以協助 安置受重建影響的居民。「如受影響的居民可獲 原區安置,當然是最理想的情況,然而市區已經 非常密集。對於需要搬到其他地區的人士,政府 可考慮補償。總括而言,香港大部分地區交通便 利,需要在整體社會的利益中取得平衡。」

就有社會人士關注文化保育, 趙錦權測量師以政 府在油尖旺的保育工作為例,指出該計劃以油麻

地作為「文化帶」的中心。保存有歷史價值地點 的其中一個方法,是將地積比轉移至同區的其他 地點。此外,市建局在九龍城「龍城」區重建項 目(衙前圍道/賈炳達道)採取融合重建、復修、 保育和活化的市區更新策略,保留小店街舖林立 的街道氛圍,保留潮州、泰國餐飲特色,同時增 加綠化空間,以及政府、機構和社區 (GIC) 設施。

陳家輝測量師闡述,北部都會區的發展過程可達 致環境保育。「當局透過成立濕地保育公園系統, 探索保護魚塘、農地、生態環境、現代化水產養 殖及漁業作業。」他相信發展項目應該遵守「環 境、社會及管治|的原則。

由於 GIC 設施已被列進地契當中,重建過程亦顧 及社會有需要人士的權益,譬如九龍城(啟德道 / 沙浦道)發展計劃中將增設幼兒服務中心。

憂市場疲弱影響重建

香港測量師學會土地政策小組主席劉振江測量師 認為,香港社會對市區重建的評價是正面的。當 市建局以市價及自置居所津貼(根據同地區內與 收回單位面積相約的七年樓齡單位) 收購業主自 住的住宅物業,許多時候(但不是一定)比強拍 提供的賠償更為優越。除了改善生活和鄰近環境, 市區重建在舊區引入新大廈,也會吸引年輕人入 住及到訪舊區,例如深水埗。興建全新建築物, 同時提供全齡友善的設計,可改善區內長者和傷 健人士的生活環境。市區重建同時亦考慮到保育 舊樓,例子包括旺角園藝街/太子道西以及上海 街近朗豪坊的保育項目。

劉振江測量師讚揚施政報告中,加大市建局的財 務能力、放寬強拍門檻、工廈重建按標準金額補 地價並將標準金額擴展至更多新界農地、成立專 責辦事處向受強拍影響的小業主提供一站式支援 服務等。他認為當局正積極有為地推動市區重建。 儘管如此,他亦關注土地和樓價下滑和市場疲弱, 將減低發展商參與重建的意欲。

与时间赛跑!直击积石山地震紧急测绘保障

12 月 18 日 23 时 59 分,甘肃省临夏州积石山县 6.2 级地震发生后,自然资源部门立即组织进行紧急测绘保障,为抗震救灾提供了强力的测绘地理资讯保障。

自然资源部调动多颗卫星拍摄制作震央影像图

地震发生后,自然资源部国土卫星遥感应用中心紧急制定了资源三号、高分一号、2米/8米光学卫星(3颗)、5米光学卫星、L波段差分乾涉SAR等7颗卫星拍摄计划,协调吉林长光、四维世景、北京二十世纪等商业卫星公司进行拍摄。截至12月20日,该中心整理提供了震前相关数据,取得提供了多景底后有关数据,第一时间提供给甘肃、青海指挥一线、心中国地质环境监测院等使用。同时,该中心也利用灾前灾后遥感影像结合高程数据,制作了灾区 DOM 数据、遥感图件及三维模拟等。

国家基础地理资讯中心依照自然资源部紧急应变计画安排,紧急进行测绘应急专题图的编制工作。截至12月21日,该中心利用最新的1:5万、1:25万地形图数据、存量影像数据以及部国土卫星遥感应用中心提供的卫星影像数据,先后制作灾区行政区划地图8幅,灾区各类灾前、灾后影像图8幅。同时将制作的紧急专题图及时推送相关部门等,为地震灾害救援提供了高效率且优质的地图保障服务。

自然资源部大地测量资料处理中心联合国家基础地埋资讯中心、甘肃省测绘工程院、青海省基础测绘院等单位,第一时间对震央附近的卫星导航定位基准站进行了资料处理与形变分析研究。研究结果表站进来积石山地震对震央附近地表存在一定的位基准站产生的上编制形成专题报告,提供了地震引起的基准站变形量和影响范围,并提出了加强震区及下,为应急救急、决策指挥和灾后重建提供支援。

甘肃厅快速启动测绘紧急保障

地震发生后,甘肃省自然资源厅紧急测绘保障队伍于30分钟内整装待命,立即准备震区地形图和0.5米遥感影像图备用,附加震中位置、地名、道路、水系等地理讯息,赶制形成灾前积石山县影像图和柳沟乡影像图,及时传送到紧急保障领导小组,供决策参考使用。

12月19日上午,甘肃厅紧急测绘保障分队11人,调派紧急测绘保障车辆3辆,携带影像取得设备无人机4架、资料处理设备集群处理设备2台、卫星讯号接收设备及配套设备若干赶往震区。下午4时左右,紧急测绘分队抵达受灾最严重的大河家镇陈家村,开始无人机倾斜摄影,航摄1.3平方千米,连夜制作加工形成资料量5.28G的大河家镇陈家村三维实景模型。

在自然资源部统一调配下,甘肃厅联系部卫星中心及时取得灾后最新 0.8 米分辨率遥感影像,并透过甘肃省自然资源政务专网传输通道,于 19 日下午 7 时前将灾后遥感影像资料传输至前方紧急测绘保障分队进行现场制图。

12月20日上午,积石山县灾前灾后遥感影像和大河家镇陈家村三维实景模型的数据和纸质图已提供给甘肃厅地震次生地质灾害排查工作小组。此外,甘肃厅紧急测绘保障分队及甘肃省地矿局测绘院于20日上午8时许开始,启用八架无人机飞行20架次,对积石山县大河家镇、石源镇、柳沟乡、刘集乡等重点受灾区域约135平方公里进行无人机测绘,取得10公分遥感影像原始资料252G,制作成果资料384G,用于地质灾害隐患检查分析。

12月21日上午,甘肃厅安排省地图院出动15名技术骨干,重点为刘集乡、大河家镇剩馀区域及石源镇镇政府所在地共约30平方公尺进行无人机测绘,取得高解析度倾斜数据,为后期评估、重建等工作做准备。

根据统计,地震发生以来,甘肃厅全面保障抗震救灾政务用图,共向省委值班室编制并提供积石山县地震波及示意图、积石山县地图、积石山县影像图、柳沟乡影像图4幅及积石山县灾前灾后影像比较图各1幅。

青海厅全力为抗震救灾提供测绘保障

积石山 6.2 级地震震央距青海省省界最近距离 5 千米, 震央 50 千米范围内涉及青海省的乡镇共 22 个。地震 发生后,青海省自然资源厅立即编制了积石山地震测 绘紧急保障工作方案,组织无人机航摄组、遥感影像 组和地图编制组迅速投入工作。

12月19日早上,3个无人机组(含紧急指挥车)分 别到达民和县中川乡、循化县道帏乡开展工作。在现 场指挥部的统一安排下,10点40分开始无人机紧急 航测作业,成功取得金田村、草滩村中心灾区 0.02 米 分辨率高清正射影像图 3.3 平方千米, 15 点 10 分将 首幅震后高清正射影像图提供现场指挥部,并向现场 消防、公安、医疗及民政等部门无偿提供基础资料及 8个批次的地图。16点30分,开始中川乡灾区周边 30 平方千米 0.08 米分辨率无人机应急航测作业,20 点 30 分提供现场指挥部使用,并按照要求将所有数 据提供国家减灾中心使用。12 月 20 日,无人机航摄 组在民和县官亭镇灾区开展无人机应急航测作业,成 功获取 0.08 米分辨率 19 平方千米原始数据,完成数 据处理后提交指挥部,并将数据上传国家减灾中心。 12月21日,无人机紧急小组6个飞行小组和6架无 人机,取得循化清水乡、白庄镇、道帏乡 1:1000 解 析度优于0.1公尺的爱灾区域正射影像约30平方米, 并安排技术人员为循化县紧急管理局提供技术援助。

遥感影像组 12 月 19 日整理了相关区域高分辨率影像,与国家国防科工局重大专项工程中心以及商业卫星服务商协调震后影像获取工作,并接收、处理震后L1 级 2 米分辨率卫星影像及 0.75 公尺解析度卫星影像共 19 景,编制官亭镇、中川乡、白庄镇、道帏乡震后卫星影像图 4 幅,提供至青海省自然资源厅紧急指挥中心。12 月 20 日,遥感影像组开始编制地震遥感监测报告,12 月 21 日向国务院抗震救灾指挥部提供民及红层土石流区震前震后高解析度卫星影像。

地图编制组于 12 月 19 日完成《甘肃省积石山县 6.2 级地震(青海)震源影响范围分布图》及《甘肃省积石山县 6.2 级地震(青海)震源影像图》制作,重点包含民和、化隆、循化三县政区及交通分布。此外,也进行了地震影响范围分析,重点检验以震源为中心范围内省域内行政村数量并编制相关图件,并安排人员配合青海厅应急指挥中心开展受灾区域大比例尺交

通、居民地分布图等应急地图编制。12 月 20 日,地图编制组编制完成民及县中川乡、官亭镇,循化县道帏藏族乡、白庄镇震后交通、居民地、学校、医院分布影像图,相关成果已提供至青海厅紧急指挥中心及前线指挥部。12 月 21 日,地图编制小组向省紧急厅指挥中心提供《甘肃省积石县 6.2 级地震(青海)影响范围影像图》《民和县中川响震前卫星影像图》。



Connection

To unite BSs of different ages, careers, and specialties through the organisation of various activities such as roundtable forums, team

building exercises, focus group discussions, questionnaires, etc, BSs should work together to amplify their power, voices, and influence so that society will recognise the important role they play in everyday life.

Promotion

To continue the encouraging results from promoting BS through the BS Channel, magazine column 福爾摩 B, media interviews, press conferences, school visits, etc, the BSD will continue to explore more opportunities to introduce the BS profession to the general public and other professional institutes through roadshows and seminars in Hong Kong's 18 districts, as well as through social gatherings with, for example, accountants and solicitors. It will also employ social media to promote its expertise and services.

Publication

To establish the best practices for building surveyors, the BSD will continue to prepare the *Guide for Design for Maintenance* for new and second-hand properties and update it. It hopes to establish widely-accepted standards for practitioners and the industry to adopt in the industry.

Education

Building Affairs Expert Determination Centre (BAEDC)

The BSD's Sr Margaret Chan and Sr Kenny Tse represented it at a seminar organised by the Property Management Services Authority on 18 December to introduce the BAEDC's ideas and mechanism to property management practitioners and explain how it can help property owners resolve disputes over water leaks and fitting-out contracts by employing single experts in the most efficient and cost-effective ways.

In addition, it received the first request to nominate an expert for a water seepage case and will pay attention to this trial case before sharing its results and the BSD's reactions to it with members in the future.

In response to the latest development, the GPD has invited Ms Jenny Choi, Deputy Secretary for Development (Planning & Lands), and Ms Fiona Chau, Principal Assistant Secretary for Development (Planning & Lands), to conduct a CPD in early February 2024. 
CPD Highlights



The first OC meeting was held on 12 December to deliberate on essential issues such as project programme/events, main themes, guests of honour, jury panels, etc.

Water Seepage Investigations and **Expert Witnesses**

Reported by Sr Danny Leung, **PFMD Council Member**

A CPD on the above topic was held on 6 November with 188 participants. Water seepage is a common building defect in Hong Kong's multi-storey buildings. The problem not only annoys and inconveniences affected owners and occupants, but could also damage a building's structure.

Sr Denny Yeung, Managing Director of Asian View Surveyors and Engineers, shared his experiences in handling water seepage investigations.




Figure 1: Typical Method Statement for Waterproofing Application

First, he introduced the typical details for waterproofing applications (Figure 1) and explained some of the following non-destructive water seepage test methods and technologies:

- 1. Rapid Infrared Thermographic Survey (RITS)
- 2. Dye Water Ponding/Flush Test
- 3. Ultrasonic Testing
- 4. Positive/Negative Pressure Water Pipe Test
- 5. Conductivity Testing
- 6. Moisture Meter Test
- 7. Microwave Scanning Test
- 8. Pipe Inspection Borescope

Later, Denny cited the typical applications of these methods with different features (Figures 2-4) including the severity level of spalling concrete (Figure 5).




Figure 3: Dye Water Ponding/ Flush Test




Figure 5: Severity Level of Spalling Concrete

Denny also shared one interesting expert witness case that involved tracing the source of water penetration from an external wall (Figure 6). In this case, a spray water test was performed on the affected flat's external wall. The test requirements called for spraying water at a water pressure of 35 psi about 300 mm from the external wall for two hours. The test started at 11 am and finished by 1 pm. Water leakage was observed along the ceiling of the flat's master bedroom. The test was successful because it concluded that the flat's seaward-facing external wall caused the water leak instead of common water seepage from the flat above.

In closing, Denny highlighted the advantages of preventive/planned maintenance (Figure 7) as an effective measure against water leaks and corresponding building defects. The PFMD thanked him for delivering such an informative topic on water seepage.

PMSA Meeting Regarding the Draft Code and Guide on "Handling the Instrument of Proxy"

Reported by Council Member Sr Jack Lee

On 4 December, the PMSA consulted various property & facility management professional bodies via Zoom to learn more about the Code of Conduct draft and its companion, Best Practice Guide on "Handling of the Instrument of Proxy".

Council Members Sr Jack Lee and Sr Nick Pang joined this meeting, which started with an introduction to both publications by the PMSA, which wants to provide a guide for licenced property management practitioners to handle the instrument of proxy more effectively and professionally. It set out the principles, standards, procedures, and standard proxy forms in a fair, transparent, and accountable manner.

Insights, feedback, and suggestions for the draft code and guide were shared, with discussions on the difficulties encountered under different scenarios such as only 48 hours being insufficient to process the instrument of proxy before the associated owners' meeting.

The consultation ended with a thank-you note and appreciation from the PMSA, while they will enrich the content of the draft code and guide based on the valuable feedback/suggestions received before finalising both.

HKIS Drinks Gathering with the Housing Department

A drinks gathering with the Housing Department was held on 5 December with the purpose of fostering a better understanding and working relationship between both parties. It was well attended by representatives of the Institute's six divisions and senior officials of the Housing Department. Immediate Past Chairman Sr Charles Hung, Past Chairman Sr Kays Wong, Vice Chairman Sr Louis Lee, and Council Member Sr Amy Tang led the PFMD delegation.

During the reception, Sr Kays Wong had the opportunity to explain the roles/work of PFM surveyors to Miss Rosanna Law, JP, Permanent Secretary for Housing/Director of Housing, and Mr Ricky Yeung, Deputy Director (Estate Management). Other PFMD members elaborated on the range of PFM services that they provided in housing management.

The PFMD hopes that this gathering enhanced the working relationship and friendship between its members and various Housing Department officials.

CPD: Latest Technological The Belt and Road Innovations in Pest Control

Reported by Council Member/ Moderator Sr Maxine Yao

On 6 December, Mr Luby Chun, the Director of Master Clean, introduced the latest innovative technologies to perform smarter pest control in buildings and homes covering mosquitos, flies, bedbugs, termites, and rodents. The impressive technologies included an In2Care mosquito control station and Biofuture Rodent Trapper (BRT). The former uses a unique approach called autodissemination. Its stations attract adult mosquitoes to lay their eggs inside them, so they should be strategically placed in areas where mosquitoes are likely to breed such as flower pots, drains, and other small containers.

The Biofuture Rodent Trapper (BRT) is an ecofriendly device that operates by luring rodents to it with foods that they prefer. Rodents climb into the machine via an external ladder and once the sensor detects them, it triggers a mechanism to flip the platform, causing the rodent to fall into the rodent capture bucket below. The bucket, filled with BioHit, renders the rodent unconscious

and eventually dead. All foods and components involved in the process are totally "free" of toxic substances. The sensor can also report to a mobile app the number of rodents caught so that the service provider can clear the capture bucket before it overflows.

Office/Commissioner Visit

Over a dozen surveyors, including Sr Kays Wong, Sr Philip Chan, and Sr Maxine Yao, met with Ar Nicolas Ho, Commissioner of the Belt and Road Office (BRO), on 6 December to discuss the anticipated difficulties, business opportunities, and successful examples encountered by surveying professionals when working on projects in Belt and Road countries. Commissioner Ho introduced a series of Government-funded programmes to enable the surveying industry to do more under the national strategies to "go global" and "attract foreign investment" (走出去,引進來) for Hong Kong.

Sr Kays has introduced the PFMD's related projects to its Mainland counterparts in recent years, whilst hopes that the Division can attract more funding so that it could organise activities, such as visits to the Middle East, remain high. Sr Maxine once led an NGO project that secured funding from some Middle Eastern countries in the form of charity. But there were difficulties in building trust and establishing a religious relationship with these countries. Once these issues are resolved, more Middle Eastern countries should have the confidence to invest in Hong Kong.

HKU Estate Office representatives greeted the visitors by delivering a comprehensive briefing



ARCHa Kucha Talk: Building a Sustainable Future by the HKIA



Unfolding Lost World War II Heritage and Promoting Geospatial and Geophysical Technologies
