Appendix

Terms and Conditions

- 1. Only those members in the Professional Grade¹ or the Technical Grade² of the Institute for not less than five (5) years are eligible to claim a non-resident and/or non-practicing concession of fifty percent (50%) of the respective annual subscription for the relevant subscription year.
- 2. Members may be required by the Institute to submit evidence in support of their applications for an annual subscription concession.
- 3. If a member is granted a concession and his circumstances change he must inform the Institute immediately and arrange to pay the **full** subscription for the immediately following calendar month and onwards. Failure on the part of the member to do so will be considered as an act of misconduct leading to disciplinary action against the member. Please note that the Institute does not have arrangements for *pro-rata* allotment of subscription fees.
- 4. Any application for non-resident concession must be received latest by the Institute by 30 April of the relevant subscription year. Late applications will **<u>not</u>** be considered by the Institute.
- 5. Concessions will <u>not</u> be granted retrospectively.
- 6. The Surveying Profession is defined as any activity or specialism within the responsibilities of any of the Six Divisions, i.e. Building Surveying, General Practice, Land Surveying, Planning and Development, Property and Facility Management and Quantity Surveying.

The Institute has **<u>absolute discretion</u>** in deciding whether or not a member is eligible for non-resident concession.
